The Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (England) Amendment No. 4 Order 1990

Partial revocation and amendment

3. In article 6, for paragraph (2) there shall be substituted the following paragraph—

- "(2) Paragraph (1) above shall not apply in the case of—
 - (a) any sheep which was moved to a market in accordance with a consent given under section 2(1) of the Act which consent did not require that the sheep to which it applies should be marked in a manner specified therein;
 - (b) any sheep which was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given under the said section 2(1) on or before 14th January 1990 which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a blue mark;
 - (c) any sheep which was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given under the said section 2(1) on or before 29th July 1990 which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with an apricot mark;
 - (d) any sheep which was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given under the said section 2(1) on or before 1st October 1989 which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a green mark; or
 - (e) any sheep which-
 - (i) was moved from any place in accordance with a consent given under the said section 2(1) which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a red mark; or
 - (ii) was moved from any place in accordance with such a consent given on or after 1st October 1990 which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a blue mark; or
 - (iii) was moved from any place in accordance with such a consent given on or after 30th July 1990 which consent was subject to the condition that the sheep to which it applies should be marked with a green mark,

and which, in any case, has been examined and marked with an ear-tag by a person authorised in that behalf by one of the Ministers.".
