NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE, ENGLAND AND WALES

The National Health Service Trusts (Pharmaceutical Services Remuneration—Special Arrangement) Order 1991

Made	6th March 1991
Laid before Parliament	11th March 1991
Coming into force	1st April 1991

The Secretary of State for Health, in exercise of powers conferred by section 103(3) and 126(4) of the National Health Service Act 1977(1) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Health Service Trusts (Pharmaceutical Services Remuneration—Special Arrangement) Order 1991 and shall come into force on lst April 1991.

(2) In this Order "the Act" means the National Health Service Act 1977.

Payments in respect of pharmaceutical services

2. Where, under Part II of the Act—

- (a) a Family Health Services Authority has paid remuneration to any person for pharmaceutical services provided by him, and
- (b) the pharmaceutical services consist of the supply of drugs, medicines or listed applicances ordered by a medical practitioner or a dental practitioner in pursuance of the functions of an NHS trust,

that NHS trust shall have the function of paying to that Family Health Services Authority the sum which that Authority, in accordance with arrangements made under section 41 of the Act(2), has paid to the person providing the pharmaceutical services.
