**The European Communities (Definition of Treaties)
(Fourth ACP–EEC Convention of Lome) Order 1991**

Made - - - - 20th March 1991

Coming into force in accordance with article 1

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th day of March 1991

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a draft of this Order has been laid before Parliament in accordance with section 1 of the European Communities Act 1972 (1) and has been approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1(3) of the European Communities Act 1972 or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the European Communities (Definition of Treaties) (Fourth ACP–EEC Convention of Lome) Order 1991. It shall come into force, in respect of each treaty specified in the Schedule to this Order, on the date on which the treaty enters into force for the United Kingdom. These dates will be notified in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes.

2. The treaties specified in the Schedule to this Order are to be regarded as Community Treaties as defined in section 1(2) of the European Communities Act 1972.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order declares the Fourth ACP—EEC Convention of Lome and the related Internal Financing Agreement to be Community Treaties as defined in section 1(2) of the European Communities Act 1972. The principal effect of declaring these agreements to be Community Treaties as so defined is to bring into play, in relation to them, the provisions of section 2 of the European Communities Act 1972 which provides for the implementation of treaties so specified.
