The Justices' Clerks (Qualifications of Assistants) (Amendment) Rules 1992

The Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 144 of the Magistrates' Courts Act 1980⁽¹⁾, after consultation with the Rule Committee appointed under the said section 144, hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Justices' Clerks (Qualifications of Assistants) (Amendment) Rules 1992 and shall come into force on 14th August 1992.

2. In Schedule 2 to the Justices' Clerks (Qualifications of Assistants) Rules 1979⁽²⁾ there shall be added the name "Nottingham Polytechnic".
