The Child Abduction and Custody (Parties to Conventions) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1994

Made - - - - *13th April 1994*

Coming into force - - *1st May 1994*

At the Court at Windsor Castle, the 13th day of April 1994

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 2 of the Child Abduction and Custody Act 1985(1), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Child Abduction and Custody (Parties to Conventions) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1994 and shall come into force on 1st May 1994.

2. The Child Abduction and Custody (Partie to Conventions) (Amendment) Order 1994(2) is amended by deleting the Schedule thereto and substituting therefor the following—
