The Secretary of State for Wales, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 126(3) of the National Health Service Act 1977(1) and section 5(1) of, and paragraph 29(1) of Schedule 2 to, the National Health Service and Community Care Act 1990(2) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, on the application of Pembrokeshire National Health Service Trust(3), and after completion of the consultation prescribed under paragraph 29(3) of Schedule 2 to the latter Act(4), hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Pembrokeshire National Health Service Trust (Dissolution) Order 1997 and shall come into force on 1st April 1997.

Dissolution of NHS trust

2. The Pembrokeshire National Health Service Trust established by the Pembrokeshire National Health Service Trust (Establishment) Order 1991(**5**) is hereby dissolved, and accordingly that Order is hereby revoked.
