The Channel 4 (Application of Excess Revenues) Order 1998

Made 24th November 1998 Coming into force 25th November 1998

Whereas a draft of this Order has been laid before, and approved by resolution of each House of Parliament pursuant to section 27(8) of the Broadcasting Act 1990(1);

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 27(7) of the Broadcasting Act 1990, hereby makes the following Order:

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Channel 4 (Application of Excess Revenues) Order 1998 and shall come into force on the day after the day on which it is made.

#### **Application of excess revenues**

2. In section 27(1)(a) of the Broadcasting Act 1990, for "331/3 per cent" substitute "nil per cent".
