**The Leicestershire and Rutland Healthcare National Health
Service Trust (Establishment) Amendment Order 1999**

Made - - - - 25th June 1999
Coming into force - - 8th July 1999

The Secretary of State for Health, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 126(3) of the National Health Service Act 1977(1) and section 5(1) of the National Health Service and Community Care Act 1990(2) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, after completion of the consultation prescribed under section 5(2) of the latter Act(3), hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Leicestershire and Rutland Healthcare National Health Service Trust (Establishment) Amendment Order 1999 and shall come into force on 8th July 1999.

Amendment of NHS trust Establishment Order

2. In article 4 of the Leicestershire and Rutland Healthcare National Health Service Trust (Establishment) Order 1998(4), for “5 non-executive” substitute “6 non-executive”.
