**The Immigration Appeals (Family Visitor) (Amendment) Regulations 2001**

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 60(6) and 166(3) of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999(1), hereby makes the following Regulations:

**Citation and commencement**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Immigration Appeals (Family Visitor) (Amendment) Regulations 2001 and shall come into force on 12th January 2001.

**Amendment of regulation 3 of the Immigration Appeals (Family Visitor) (No. 2) Regulations 2000**

2. The Immigration Appeals (Family Visitor) (No. 2) Regulations 2000(2) shall be amended as follows:

- (a) in regulation 3(1)(a), for the figure “£500” there shall be substituted the figure “£125”; and
- (b) in regulation 3(1)(b), for the figure “£150” there shall be substituted the figure “£50”.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulation)*

These Regulations amend the Immigration Appeals (Family Visitor) (No. 2) Regulations 2000. They reduce the fee that is to be paid by a person who wishes to exercise a right of appeal as a family visitor from £500 to £125 for those who elect an oral hearing; and from £150 to £50 in all other cases.
