The Birmingham Specialist Community Health National Health Service Trust (Transfer of Trust Property) Order 2002

Made - - - - - *8th March 2002*

Laid before Parliament *11th March 2002*

Coming into force *1st April 2002*

The Secretary of State for Health, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 92(1) and 126(4) of the National Health Service Act 1977(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, having regard to changes or proposed changes in the arrangements for the administration of the Birmingham Specialist Community Health National Health Service Trust and having consulted that Trust and the South Birmingham Primary Care Trust in accordance with section 92(3) of that Act, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Birmingham Specialist Community Health National Health Service Trust (Transfer of Trust Property) Order 2002 and shall come into force on 1st April 2002.

(2) In this Order—

“the old Trust” means the Birmingham Specialist Community Health National Health Service Trust(b);

“the new Trust” means the South Birmingham Primary Care Trust(c);

“the trust property” means the property specified in the schedule of trust property prepared and agreed by the old Trust and the new Trust and signed on behalf of the old Trust and on behalf of the new Trust on 31st January 2002.

Transfer of trust property

2.—(1) On 1st April 2002 the trust property, and any rights and liabilities arising from that property(d), shall be transferred from the old Trust to the new Trust.

As regards Wales, the functions of the Secretary of State under the above mentioned powers are transferred to the National Assembly for Wales under article 2(a) of the National Assembly for Wales (Transfer of Functions) Order 1999 S.I. 1999/672 as amended by section 66(5) of the 1999 Act; this order therefore only extends to England.

(d) See section 96(1) of the 1977 Act as amended by paragraph 29 of Schedule 4 to the 1999 Act which makes supplementary provision regarding transfers of property under section 92 of that Act.

(2) In any trust instrument relating to the trust property, any reference to the name by which the trustees of the trust property are to be known shall be construed as a reference to the new Trust and any reference to the old Trust in the name by which the charitable trust governing the trust property is to be known shall be construed as a reference to the new Trust.
