**The Education (Assisted Places) (Amendment) (England)  
Regulations 2004**

<i>Made</i> - - - -	<i>22nd July 2004</i>
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	<i>30th July 2004</i>
<i>Coming into force</i> - -	<i>1st September 2004</i>

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by section 3(1), (2) and (4) of the Education (Schools) Act 1997(a), and after consulting, in accordance with section 3(7) of that Act, such bodies as appear to him to be appropriate and representative of schools which provide assisted places under section 2(1) of that Act, the Secretary of State for Education and Skills hereby makes the following Regulations:

**Citation, commencement and application**

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Education (Assisted Places) (Amendment) (England) Regulations 2004 and come into force on 1st September 2004.
- (2) These Regulations apply in relation to a school year beginning on or after that date.
- (3) These Regulations apply only in relation to England.

**Amendment of the Education (Assisted Places) Regulations 1997**

- 2.—(1) The Education (Assisted Places) Regulations 1997 (b) are amended as follows.
- (2) In regulation 10(4) and (6), substitute “£1,540” for “£1,500” in each place where it appears.
- (3) In paragraph 1 of Schedule 2, substitute “£11,935” for “£11,626”.
- (4) For the table following paragraph 2(1) of that Schedule substitute the following table—

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations further amend the Education (Assisted Places) Regulations 1997 (“the 1997 Regulations”) in respect of the school year beginning on or after 1st September 2004. The reductions to be made in relevant income in respect of dependent relatives pursuant to regulation 10(4) and (6) of the 1997 Regulations are increased from £1,500 to £1,540.

These Regulations amend the means test for the remission of fees: the level of income at or below which fees are to be wholly remitted is set at £11,935 instead of £11,626, with corresponding increases in the extent of remission where relevant income exceeds that sum.
