The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by article 35 of the Hovercraft (General) Order 1972(1) and with the approval of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Hovercraft (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 2004 and shall come into force on 6th September 2004.

Amendment of the Hovercraft (Fees) Regulations 1997

- 2.—(1) The Hovercraft (Fees) Regulations 1997(2) shall be amended as follows.
- (2) In regulation 5, for "£60" there shall be substituted "£78".
- (3) For the table in regulation 9 there shall be substituted the following table:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Hovercraft (Fees) Regulations 1997 (S.I.1997/320) (the principal Regulations) to prescribe changes in some of the fees charged.

In Part 3 of the principal Regulations, the hourly rate chargeable under regulation 5 for the services specified in regulation 6 has been increased from £60 to £78.

Revised fees have been introduced in respect of the additional fees payable under regulation 9 of the principal Regulations. The changes to the fees charged are as follows:
