COMBINATION OF POLLS

PART I

General Provisions

1. For the purposes of combining the poll at—
- (a) a Parliamentary general election⁽¹⁾,
 - (b) a European Parliamentary election,
 - (c) a local government election,
 - (d) a mayoral election conducted under the Local Authorities (Mayoral Elections) (England and Wales) Regulations 2002, or
 - (e) another referendum,

with the poll at a referendum, the provisions specified in column (1) of the Table below shall be modified as specified in column (2).
