#### Information

### Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974

- **54.**—(1) Sections 28(2) and (7) of the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 <sup>M1</sup> (restrictions on disclosure of information) do not apply to the disclosure of information by the Health and Safety Executive to another responder if the disclosure is made
  - (a) in connection with the performance by that other responder of a duty under
    - (i) section 2 or 4;
    - (ii) a provision of these Regulations; or
    - (iii) a provision in regulations made by the Scottish Ministers under Part 1;
  - (b) in connection with another function of that responder which relates to emergencies; or
  - (c) in connection with a function of the Health and Safety Executive which relates to emergencies.
- (2) For the purposes of paragraph (1), it is immaterial whether the disclosure is made pursuant to a request made under regulation 47.
- (3) In paragraph (1), the reference to the [FIH]ealth and Safety Executive includes a reference to an officer of the Executive.
