

**EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO THE
ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP (ENGLAND) REGULATIONS 2005**

1.

1.1 This explanatory memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and is laid before Parliament by Command of Her Majesty.

1.2 This memorandum contains information for the Joint Committee on Statutory Instruments.

2. Description

2.1 These Regulations provide for the creation of Environmental Stewardship (ES), a new agri-environment scheme which comprises three elements: Entry Level Stewardship (ELS), Organic Entry Level Stewardship (OELS) and Higher Level Stewardship (HLS). The scheme replaces three existing agri-environment schemes, namely, Countryside Stewardship (CSS), Environmentally Sensitive Areas (ESAs) and the Organic Farming Scheme (OFS).

3. Matters of Special Interest to the Joint Committee on Statutory Instruments

3.1 Reference is made in the definition of “less favoured area” in regulation 2 of the Regulations to three volumes of maps showing the “less favoured area” of England, which is coloured blue and pink. The Department has provided a copy of a map showing all the Less Favoured Areas in the UK, printed at a considerably smaller scale than the maps referred to in regulation 2. The official maps of the English Less Favoured Areas are in three volumes containing 235 pages of coloured A3 maps at a scale of 1:50,000. These may be viewed (by prior appointment) at the Department’s Information Resource Centre which is located at 2 Horseferry Road, London SW1 2AL (telephone 020 7238 6712).

3.2 The location of Less Favoured Areas in England can also be found using the interactive map at the website of Multi-Agency Geographic Information for the Countryside. The interactive map can display the less favoured area status of any land in England with a co-ordinate accuracy of one metre at a scale of 1:25,000. 3.3 Reference is also made in regulation 2 of the Regulations (in the definition of “organic standards”) to the Department’s Compendium of UK Organic Standards, May 2004 Edition. 4. Legislative Background

4.1 The Regulations implement certain provisions (particularly Articles 22 to 24) of Council Regulation (EC) No 1257/1999. They are made under section 98 of the Environment Act 1995 and section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 (which is required in particular in respect of Article 22(d)).

5. Extent

5.1 This instrument applies to England.

6. European Convention of Human Rights

6.1 Not applicable.

7. Policy Background

7.1 England's Rural Development Programme currently includes three agri-environment schemes (CSS, ESAs and OFS), under which over 30,000 agreements are currently in force. CSS and ESAs agreements focus on land of high or potentially high ecological value, and OFS agreements on land which is farmed organically.

7.2 In its report of January 2002, the Policy Commission on the Future of Farming and Food recommended that Defra review existing agri-environment schemes and introduce a basic agri-environment scheme that would be open to as many farms in England as possible.

7.3 The existing schemes have been reviewed and an extensive series of consultations has led to the development of ES. Details of these consultations are set out at: www.defra.gov.uk, and a list of all the organisations consulted is attached to this Memorandum at Annex A. All principal stakeholders including English Nature, English Heritage, Countryside Agency, Environment Agency and the main farming and environmental organisations have been fully involved in the review process and are members of the agri-environment review steering group that has framed ES. This steering group will continue to review and evaluate the effectiveness of the scheme regularly.

7.4 ES will have similar objectives to the existing agri-environment schemes, namely, increasing biodiversity and access to the countryside, and protecting its historic and landscape features. ES will also have a new primary objective of resource protection, and new secondary objectives of flood protection and genetic conservation.

7.5 ES will comprise three elements:

- ELS will be open to all farmers and land managers who want to deliver a basic level of environmental management above that of Good Farming Practice.
- OELS will be open to all farmers registered with an organic body but which are not receiving aid under OFS.

- HLS will be open to those farmers who want to deliver higher levels of environmental management.
- 7.6 ELS has been designed to be open to all landowners and farmers as a simple means of providing environmental benefits. It is aimed at tackling countrywide environmental problems such as diffuse pollution, loss of biodiversity and landscape character, and damage to the historic environment. It is open to all applicants who can meet the scheme requirements. This element will be the key measure aimed at reversing the decline in farmland birds. It is estimated that the majority of farmers in England will join this scheme in the next few years. OELS has similar management options to ELS, but they are tailored to the management of organic land.
- 7.7 HLS will build on the successes of CSS and ESAs by concentrating on land of higher ecological value. Prescriptions will be more flexible than hitherto so as to tailor them to individual sites. This element will be one of the principal instruments in meeting the Public Service Agreement target on SSSIs.
- 7.8 The existing agri-environment schemes are now closed to new applications, but they will continue to operate until all of the agreements entered into under them expire. As some of the agreements entered into under CSS and ESAs last for 10 years, these schemes will continue to operate until 2014. OFS agreements last for 5 years and this scheme will continue to operate until 2009. It is planned that the first ES agreements will come into force on 1 August 2005.
- 7.9 The Regulations amend the England Rural Development Programme (Enforcement) Regulations 2000 (S.I. 2000/3044) to give the Secretary of State enforcement powers in relation to ES.
- 7.10 The scheme has been approved by the EC Commission. This instrument implements the scheme.

8. Impact

- 8.1 A Regulatory Impact Assessment has not been prepared for this instrument as it has no detrimental impact on business, charities or voluntary bodies because participation in the scheme is voluntary.
- 8.2 At present over £150 million per year is spent on agri-environment schemes. An additional £150 million per year will be made available to underpin the new entry level element of ES. Half of this new money will come from modulation, which involves a percentage deduction from support payments under the Common Agricultural Policy
