Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Cosmetic Products (Safety) (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations 2006 and shall come into force on 29th November 2006.

2. Regulation 5(15)(d) of the Cosmetic Products (Safety) Regulations 2004(**b**) is amended by substituting for the date "31st November 2006" the date "30th November 2006".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Cosmetic Products (Safety) Regulations 2004 (S.I. 2004/2152) ("the Principal Regulations") to correct an error that was introduced by the Cosmetic Products (Safety) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 2006. These Regulations amended the Principal Regulations by prohibiting the placing on the market or the supply of certain substances in hair dyes after 31st November 2006. These Regulations correct that date to 30th November 2006.
