THE HOUSING (APPROVAL OF CODES OF MANAGEMENT PRACTICE) (STUDENT ACCOMMODATION) (ENGLAND) ORDER 2006 2006 No. 646

and

THE HOUSES IN MULTIPLE OCCUPATION (SPECIFIED EDUCATIONAL ESTABLISHMENTS) (ENGLAND) REGULATIONS 2006 2006 No. 647

1. This explanatory memorandum has been prepared by The Office of the Deputy Prime Minister ("ODPM") and is laid before Parliament by Command of Her Majesty.

2. Description

2.1 The above named Order approves the attached three codes of practice laying down standards of conduct and practice to be followed with regard to the management of houses in multiple occupation (HMOs) and other buildings that are occupied solely or principally by persons who occupy them for the purpose of undertaking a full-time educational course. The codes mentioned in article 2(2)(a) and (b) of the Order are codes for premises where owners or landlords are the educational establishments providing the courses. The third code mentioned in article 2(2)(c) relates to the management of buildings that the educational establishments may or may not own, but in respect of which they do not have full management responsibility or control. Each code lists in its schedule the buildings that are managed in conformity with the code.

2.2 The above mentioned Regulations specify certain educational establishments managing or having control; of buildings which are not HMOs for the purpose of the Housing Act 2004 ("the Act") (excluding Part 1 of the Act, which deals with housing conditions). The combined effect of these two instruments is that the buildings managed by the specified establishments and listed in the schedules of the codes referred to in article 2(2)(a) and (b) of the Order are not HMOs for the purposes of the Act (except Part 1), and in consequence, will not be subject to mandatory licensing by the local housing authority for the district in which they are located under part 2 of the Act.

3. Matters of special interest to the Joint Committee on Statutory Instruments

3.1 None.

4. Legislative Background

4.1 Under section 233(1) of the Act the "appropriate national authority" may by order approve a code of practice (whether prepared by that authority or another person) laying down standards of conduct and practice to be followed with regard to the management of houses in multiple occupation or of excepted accommodation. Excepted accommodation is defined in section 233(9) of the Act as being such description of living accommodation falling within any provision of Schedule 14 (buildings which are not HMOs for the purposes of provisions other than Part 1) as is specified in such an order.

4.2 Under section 233(2) of the Act, before approving a code of practice the appropriate national authority must take reasonable steps to consult persons involved in the management of premises of these kinds, persons occupying such premises, or persons whom the authority considers represent the interests of such persons. Details of the consultation undertaken are given at paragraph 7.

4.3 Under section 233(3) of the Act the appropriate national authority may only approve a code of practice if it is satisfied that the code has been published (whether by the authority or by another person) in a manner that the authority considers appropriate for the purpose of bringing the code to the attention of those likely to be affected by it, or if it is satisfied that arrangements have been made for the code to be so published. Publication arrangements are described at paragraph 7.

4.4 The Order approves the three codes named in article 2(2) of the Order.

4.5 Schedule 14 to the Act describes the buildings which are not houses in multiple occupation for any purpose of the Act other than those of Part 1. This includes in paragraph 4 of that Schedule any building which is occupied solely or principally by persons who occupy it for the purpose of undertaking a full-time course of further or higher education at an educational establishment specified by the appropriate national authority, or at an establishment of a description specified by the appropriate national authority, and where the person managing or having control of it is the educational establishment in question or a person of a description specified by the appropriate specified by the appropriate for the purpose of the establishment in question or a person of a description specified by the appropriate for the purpose of the establishment in for the purposes of paragraph 4 of Schedule 14.

4.6 By virtue of section 261(1) of the Act the Secretary of State is the appropriate national authority for statutory instruments in relation to England. This is the first time the powers contained in section 233 or in paragraph 4 of Schedule 14 to the Act have been exercised in relation to England.

5. Extent

5.1 This instrument applies to England .

6. European Convention on Human Rights

6.1 As these instruments are subject to negative resolution procedure and do not amend primary legislation, no statement is required.

7. Policy background

7.1 The Act seeks to improve the physical conditions in the private rented housing sector. A particular focus, through its licensing provisions, is to improve the management of HMOs.

7.2 Student housing was a significant issue in debates during the Act's passage through Parliament. Almost two thirds of all students live in the private rented sector, indeed many continue to rent after university. However, just over a third of students are thought to live in purpose built accommodation provided by the university or a commercial provider. If HMOs can be difficult to manage then student halls of residence offer management challenges of even greater complexity. That is why a code of management practice was seen to be needed well before changes to the Housing Bill provided for the approval of codes of practice for student accommodation. However, paragraph 4 of Schedule 14 to the Act, which (subject to regulations) excepts specific kinds of student accommodation from the HMO definition of the Act, recognises that a balance needs to be struck. Whilst there is a clear need to improve the standards in student accommodation, this has to be balanced with the additional costs that would fall to higher education establishments were they to be required to license all their halls of residence and other accommodation provided by the establishment.

7.3 The two codes written by Accredited Network UK/Unipol are closely based upon a code that was first published by them in November 2004. All three codes have been developed by the code writers throughout 2005 following extensive consultation with main stakeholders, including student representatives and providers of student accommodation, and in liaison with ODPM. ODPM conducted a written consultation over a four week period, which was reduced from the usual 12 week period due to the extensive consultation that had already taken place by the code writers. ODPM consulted the groups that the code writers had consulted and local authority and landlord representatives. At the end of the consultation period ODPM continued taking the views of main stakeholders, in particular, the national Union of Students, who had raised concerns on behalf of its members.

7.4 There was no opposition to the principle of approving codes designed specifically for the management of student accommodation. However, there was initially strong opposition by the National Union of Students to the content of some parts of the UUK code. Following the responses to the consultation in September the authors of these codes have developed their codes further to ensure they meet the concerns of the stakeholders, in particular the National Union of Students. The changes made to the UUK code resulted in it reflecting more closely the content of the ANUK code.

7.5 ANUK and UUK have, of their own volition, agreed a protocol on the mutual development of their codes that could lead to their convergence in 3 years. They will have representation on each others' management committees and the NUS and the ODPM will also be represented on these committees. The parties involved in the drafting these codes, including the NUS, generally

accept that, at present, these codes are the best that can be achieved. They also accept that there is scope for the further development of these codes. The Government's response to the consultation outlines areas in which improvements should, in future, be addressed by their review processes. The Government seeks annual reviews of these codes on matters marked for further improvement. The ODPM will carry out a full review on whether the codes are robust and coherent after 3 years (as part of its review of licensing).

7.6 The codes will be published on the respective websites of Universities UK (UUK), the Accreditation Network UK (ANUK) and Unipol. Each contain a schedule listing the properties that are being managed in compliance with the code as at 20th February 2006. Paper copies of the codes will be made available by the code writers on request. Both ANUK and UUK plan to issue leaflets publicising their respective codes with a view to bringing them to the attention of those likely to be affected by them. All three codes require the persons managing student accommodation to provide student tenants, who are the principal beneficiaries of these codes, with full information about the existence and operation of the code relevant to their buildings. The UUK code requires this to be done at the start of a student's tenancy the ANUK code requires it to be done through the letting and marketing materials and tenant information provided to potential or existing tenants. The Secretary of State is, therefore, reasonably satisfied that arrangements have been made for the codes to be published in a manner that is appropriate for the purpose of bringing them to the attention of those likely to be affected by them.

8. Impact

8.1 The purpose of developing these codes of practice is to reduce the regulatory impact of licensing on larger student accommodation. By agreeing to comply with a code of practice certain student accommodation may be excepted from the HMO definition and therefore will not be subject to mandatory licensing under Part 2 of the Act. For commercial undertakings that comply with a code of practice there is the prospect of lower costs and less direct regulation under licensing.

8.3 No regulatory impact assessment has been provided as the impact on the public sector of complying with a code of practice is estimated to be very significantly less than £5m. In any one year the number of students (at whatever stage in their studies) that are accommodated in University maintained property is in the region of 300,000. The number of students accommodated in privately maintained halls of residence is in the region of 100,000. This gives a total of 400,000 students or bed spaces. If all this accommodation had to be licensed at anywhere near the indicative maximum licensing fee of £180 for 5 years (or £36 per year) the total cost could be £14.4m. But for property that is managed and controlled by a higher educational establishment the costs of complying with a code of practice are estimated at only £0.70 per bed space. So for 300,000 bed spaces the total cost would be only £210,000.

8.6 However, for privately maintained property that is managed in compliance with an approved code, but subject to licensing, a significantly reduced licensing fee would be justified. That would reflect the fact that the local authority could rely to a considerable extent on compliance to the code of practice. Therefore if the licensing fee were reduced to say £10 per bedroom and the accreditation fee of £0.70, the total annual cost for 100,000 bed spaces would be little over £1m.

Universities UK/SCOP Code of Practice for the Management of Student Housing

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Introduction, Purpose and Scope

Introduction

i) This Code has been prepared primarily to assist managers, and anyone involved in the management, of student accommodation by setting out the main elements of good management practice. It covers, among other matters, health and safety, maintenance and repair, and relationships between managers and student tenants. It also should assist students in understanding both the standards and procedures applying to their accommodation and their obligations as tenants or licensees.

ii) The Standing Conference of Principals (SCOP), the Association of University Directors of Estates (AUDE), the Association for Student Residential Accommodation (ASRA), the Conference of University Business Officers (CUBO), the University Safety and Health Association (USHA), the Association of University Heads of Administration (AUHA), the Association of University Chief Security Officers (AUCSO) and the Association of Managers of Student Services (AMOSSHE) have cooperated in the preparation of the Code. The Office of the Deputy Prime Minister, the National Union of Students (NUS) and the Accreditation Network UK (ANUK) have been consulted during its preparation.

iii) This Code has been designed having regard to the particular characteristics of student housing, and to management practice, in the higher education sector. Where appropriate it may serve also as the code for further education establishments (FEEs). In considering signing up to this Code FEEs, like higher education establishments (HEEs), will need to ensure that their management practice (for example with respect to complaints procedures) is compatible with the Code. All the provisions of this Code will apply to FE accommodation except insofar as other legislation, notably with regard to students aged under 18, specifically applies.

iv) Administration arrangements for this Code are set out in Section 8. These are intended to serve the overall purposes of the Code – helping to maintain and enhance standards and to set out clearly what students may expect of their accommodation and its management. They also provide mechanisms for identifying, and helping remedy, any shortcomings in management of student accommodation. Where audit and/or complaints indicate a persistent management failure an HEE (or FEE) may be deemed to be no longer compliant with the Code.

Purpose

v) Arrangements for the management of student accommodation vary considerably between HEEs and a range of professional HE bodies is involved in giving information and advice on one or other aspect of housing provision and management. The Code, therefore, is intended to meet a recognised need in the HE and FE sectors for a "source document" covering a broad range of issues pertaining to HE residential accommodation. It outlines best practice and provides bench marks for the management - and quality - of student housing in the sector.

vi) It is intended to serve also as the approved code of practice for HE and FE "managed and controlled" accommodation under the Housing Act 2004 which, among other provisions, introduces a system of licensing for houses in multiple occupation (HMOs). The national authority (the Secretary of State in England or the National Assembly for Wales) may "except" from the definition of an HMO, for the purposes of licensing, accommodation managed or controlled by higher or further education

establishments¹ where the accommodation is used solely or principally by persons for the purpose of undertaking a full time course of further or higher education. They may be excepted on the basis that each establishment and its buildings so excepted would be managed in conformity with an approved code of practice.

vii) The Act further provides² that the national authority may approve one or more codes of practice laying down standards of conduct and practice to be followed with regard to the management of HMOs or of accommodation excepted from the definition of an HMO.

viii) Formal accreditation to a code is a matter for those managing a code and is a voluntary undertaking for those managers of accommodation who so commit to the code. As is the case for codes of practice approved under other legislation, approval of a code under Section 233 of the Housing Act 2004 does not have the effect of making a breach of that code an offence nor does breach create a civil liability. However, the code may be used as evidence of good practice by a court or tribunal.

ix) Regulations to be made under the Act are to except student accommodation which is "managed and controlled" in conformity with an approved code. In this context managed and controlled by a higher or further education establishment is taken to mean that the establishment carries the main responsibility for repair and maintenance and for the day to day landlord and tenant relationship. Annex A explains the method by which a determination should be made of which buildings are managed and controlled for the purpose of this Code. The method will be subject to an early review.

x) There is much variety in student housing in HE and FE estates. It ranges from historic buildings to buildings of the 21st. century and, for example, from accommodation built and equipped specifically for a college style and culture to that provided to meet demand for more independent living. This has practical implications for the specification of best management practice. It requires a generic approach rather than an overly detailed specification and, of necessity, a local as well as a national dimension. This Code, therefore, indicates *the main principles which should be observed and the essential requirements which must be met* in order to meet the criteria for formal accreditation (see Section 8 of this Code).

xi) As experience is gained in implementing the Housing Act 2004, particularly with regard to codes of practice, this Code will be amended. In making amendments regard will be had to changes in regulatory requirements, and to developing requirements and standards within the HE and FE sectors.

Scope

xii) Higher (and further) education establishments have distinctive management arrangements including independent governing bodies. They are subject to both internal and external independent audit. The relationship between university or college authorities and students as tenants, or licensees, therefore differs in some important respects from the landlord/tenant relationship in the privately rented sector. Moreover a range of statutory requirements applies to HE provided student housing, some general but some specific. The scope of this Code therefore reflects the particular circumstances of HEEs. It has been developed from established procedures

and good practice in the HE sector. It takes account also of other codes designed to have a wider application.

xiii) This Code applies in England and Wales and only to student accommodation managed and controlled by HEEs, or by further education establishments.

xiv) The Code has been prepared having regard to the requirements for licensed houses in multiple occupation under the Housing Act 2004. Codes provide greater detail and advice on best practice. However as the relevant ODPM consultation paper states, codes are not intended to set new or higher physical standards than those in that legislation "other than for aspirational purposes".³

xv) This Code has both "mandatory" and aspirational elements. The basic requirements are those that would need to be met were the relevant properties to be subject to licensing under the Act. They are concerned with fire safety, maintenance of gas and electricity installations, water supply and drainage, toilets, sinks, washbasins, installations for storing food, disposal of refuse and litter, maintenance of common areas (e.g. yards, gardens), windows and ventilation, repair of internal structure and post boxes. Additional basic requirements are that tenants are to be advised on action to be taken in case of emergencies and that managers must be allowed reasonable access to the premises.

xvi) A number of other matters that pertain to the quality of student accommodation and its management are included also. As with the basic requirements, the intention is to indicate best management practice of student housing in the sector.

xvii) Some HE and FE accommodation will not fall within the definition of an HMO. Other accommodation may constitute a house in multiple occupation and not be compliant with the Code and not subject to licensing. Some, for one reason or another, may require to be licensed (see Section 8 and Annex B). It is possible that some may be subject to proposals for additional licensing.

xviii) It should be noted that while HE or FE accommodation that is managed in compliance with the Code may be exempt from licensing under the Housing Act, such accommodation is not exempt from the provisions on housing standards in Part 1 of the Act. The new approach to assessing housing conditions (the Housing, Health and Safety Rating System, HHSRS) applies to all housing – including local authority housing⁴.

xix) Annex B gives a brief outline of the principal provisions of the Housing Act 2004 relevant to student accommodation managed and controlled by HEEs.

xxi) It is the intention that, in principle, this Code should apply to all the student housing managed and controlled by a higher education establishment. However some of the provisions of the Code will not be applicable to certain small off-street individual properties leased by HEEs from private providers and these should be excluded from the list of buildings in the Schedule. (See Annex A to this Code for the full definition). There will be some variation, moreover, in the extent to which the

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Code applies. For example, weekly fire alarm tests would not be appropriate in the case of small buildings. And in certain circumstances the requirements of other legislation e.g. on listed buildings may not permit full compliance. The buildings listed in the Schedule should be those solely or principally occupied by students undertaking a full time course of further or higher education and which are managed and controlled by the education establishment providing the course.

Code of Practice

1. General

1.1 This Code assumes an establishment's compliance with all statutory requirements under the housing, building, planning, disability discrimination, equal opportunities, data protection and other relevant legislation. As noted in paragraph iii) of this Code, the provisions of this Code will apply to FE accommodation except insofar as other legislation, notably with regard to students aged under 18, applies. Some references are made in the text to specific requirements where this may be helpful to accommodation managers. As is the case in some other codes, the word "must" is generally used to indicate a statutory requirement.

1.2 The Code should be read in conjunction with the establishment's regulations, rules, codes and other local documentation relevant to the subject matter of this Code. HEEs should ensure that their documentation provides evidence of compliance with the Code.

1.3 HEEs should ensure that student representatives are fully involved in review, complaints and other procedures integral to the administration of this Code.

2. Health and safety standards and procedures

2.1 Student residences and their contents as supplied by an HEE must meet the requirements of all relevant health and safety regulations and codes of practice. Certain special circumstances (e.g. legislation relating to listed buildings) may justify a partial relaxation of these requirements.

2.2 HEEs should make an analysis of the risk of such events as fire, outbreak of disease or major breakdown and develop procedures for dealing with them. The analysis and the procedures should be documented (e.g. in risk registers) and should be available for inspection by residents.

2.3 Students should be given clear advice on what action is to be taken in the event of an emergency e.g. first aid provision, means of calling an ambulance. They should be provided with contact details for emergencies and informed of procedures for reporting accidents or safety defects.

2A. Fire safety

Prevention

2.4 Information and advice should be provided to students at the beginning of their period of occupation on such matters as:

- Their role in the avoidance of fire risks
- Cooking
- Electrical safety particularly voltage differences
- The dangers of using candles or storing flammable material

- Disciplinary action that may be taken if fire alarms or fire fighting equipment is mis -used
- Fire extinguishers

Essential information should be posted in kitchens and communal areas and this, together with more general information, should be available in printed form and/or on web sites.

Detection and alarm

2.5 Fire safety systems must be maintained in working order and regularly tested in accordance with regulations relating to each particular piece of equipment and each building type. The design and detail of systems in existing buildings will be determined in accordance with a fire safety risk assessment and in consultation with the fire authority or local authority as appropriate.

Specifically:

- Fire alarm systems should be tested weekly at pre-arranged times (but see paragraph xxi) of this Code)
- A record of fire alarm testing and inspection should be maintained
- At the beginning of their period of occupation students should be provided with information on fire safety and good practice. Advice on action to be taken in case of fire including fire containment procedures should be prominently displayed
- Any fire extinguishing equipment provided should be properly maintained

Escape

2.6 The means of fire escape – internal and external – should be maintained and be available at all times. The design and detail of systems in existing buildings will be determined in accordance with a fire safety risk assessment and in consultation with the fire authority or local authority as appropriate. Safety systems such as:

- Emergency lighting
- Emergency secondary power supplies such as generators and battery back up systems
- Fire door integrity including door closures
- Automatic door release mechanisms
- Emergency escape ironmongery such as push bars

should be regularly tested in accordance with the appropriate British Standard.

2.7 Fire evacuation practices should be conducted at the beginning of each academic year in accordance with arrangements for particular buildings and fire detection systems agreed with the local fire authority. A record should be maintained.

2.8 So as to ensure safe evacuation of properties in the event of fire, safe access and egress must be maintained – including corridors, landings, stairs and hallways.

2.9 Students with disabilities should make themselves known at the beginning of their first term or as soon as otherwise practicable so that they may be advised of any

special arrangements (e.g. personal evacuation plans) which are in place for them in case of fire or other emergency.

2B. Electricity and gas supplies

2.10 Except in the case of emergencies or essential maintenance, electricity and gas supplies and lighting must be maintained without interruption. Gas and electrical installations must be properly maintained and tested in accordance with gas safety regulations and British Standards.

2.11 Instructions should be provided on the safe operation of all gas or electrically operated equipment.

Gas Installations

2.12 All gas supplies, distribution pipe work and gas fired appliances must comply with the relevant gas safety regulations.

2.13 All gas appliances must have an annual gas safety check undertaken by a CORGI registered gas installer. A copy of the safety certificate must be available in accordance with the regulations.

2.14 Where students need to operate controls for gas fired central heating or hot water systems, simple and precise instructions for their safe and efficient use must be available.

Electrical Installations

2.15 All new electrical installations including fixed equipment must be installed and all existing installations maintained in accordance with the most recent version of the Institute of Electrical Engineers (IEE) Regulations.

2.16 All building electrical installations must be inspected and tested in accordance with the IEE Regulations, currently at least every 5 years, and the results recorded in an appropriate register.

Electric Heating

2.17 Where rooms are provided with fixed electric heating, instructions on the use of the equipment should be available.

Portable Appliance Testing (PAT)

2.18 All portable appliances supplied by an HEE, or used in the premises by HEE staff, should be inspected and maintained in accordance with an establishment's PAT policy. Where arrangements exist for the testing of students' personal electrical equipment these should be set down in the PAT policy.

2.19 It will be a requirement in every tenancy or licensing agreement for the student to maintain a reasonably safe environment for the HEE's employees who may have to enter the premises e.g. ensuring that cables to personal electrical equipment are safe.

2.20 There should be a procedure for dealing with any potentially dangerous personal electrical equipment. This might include labelling as unsafe, an instruction to remove, or in extreme cases, for example if there is a risk of fire or electrocution, removal to safe keeping or disabling. In such circumstances HEIs should inform the students concerned.

Water Supplies

2.21 All premises must be provided with hot and cold water to appropriately marked taps. Any cold water supply that is not drinkable should be clearly identified.

Waste water

2.22 All waste water must be removed via an appropriate trapped connection to the sewerage system.

Water Hygiene

2.23 Hot and cold water services must be installed, monitored and maintained in accordance with HSE and statutory public health requirements.

Lighting

2.24 Lighting should be provided in accordance with the Chartered Institution of Building Services Engineers (CIBSE) recommendations. In study bedrooms the recommended level of illumination may be achieved by the use of local task lighting.

2C Security

Building and room security

2.25 Students' accommodation should be secure against intrusion. Subject to local risk assessment, main entrance and individual bedroom doors should be lockable, the main entrance door being accessible by all student tenants of the building and bedroom doors accessible only by the student occupant. Arrangements for access in the event of lost keys etc should be set out in the students' welcome pack or equivalent.

2.26 All ground and first floor windows must be securable by the student. In any event windows should not present a safety hazard and, subject to local risk assessment, all windows should be fitted with stops to prevent over-opening.

Security staff

2.27 Security staff should be appropriately identified. Staff should be subject to vetting under the relevant legislation. Security staff accessing bedrooms in the absence of the student should be required to keep a log recording the reason for access.

Security Plan

2.28 HEEs should have a security plan which identifies the general approach to security matters. The plan should include procedures in the event of an emergency e.g. bomb alert, summoning ambulance.

CCTV

2.29 Wherever student residences are monitored by CCTV this will be advised in the foyer or on the external entrance to the building. Installation and operation will be in accordance with the relevant legislation.

2D Kitchen facilities, food storage, washing facilities, furnishing, cleaning routines and other matters

Kitchen

2.30 Where provided, all kitchen facilities should be maintained in good order and repair with all equipment supplied in working order. Facilities for the preparation, cooking and storage of food should be appropriate to the number of students using the facilities. Users' instructions should be available.

Food storage

2.31 Cold storage provision should be made available within self-catering properties and where necessary students should have the means to lock and secure this so as to prevent pilfering.

Bathroom, toilet and shower areas

2.32 These areas should be provided with adequate ventilation and slip-resistant flooring. All sanitary ware should be in good working order and free from cracks and breaks. All toilets should be provided with fitted toilet seat. Shower curtains or screens should be provided as appropriate.

En-suite facilities

2.33 Where provided, these should comprise sanitary ware located within a study bedroom or between two adjacent single study bedrooms for the sole use of the resident(s) of the room(s). The facility, although contained in the room, should have external ventilation and an entrance door fitted making it a self contained unit.

Furnishing quality

2.34 Décor and furnishings should be in good order with regular checks taken on defects and refurbishment programmes. All furnishings provided must conform to the relevant regulations. All bedrooms should be fitted as a minimum with bed, mattress, worktop, chair, curtains/blind, drawers/shelving, wardrobe and waste receptacle.

Cleaning

2.35 Students should be advised of cleaning schedules. These should include property cleaning and student responsibility for cleaning of property. All rooms should be prepared for the start of occupancy in accordance with a service level statement (See paragraph 5.2).

Laundry facilities

2.36 Where provided, these should be in good working order. Instructions, including fault reporting and emergency procedures, should be available.

Energy

2.37 When consistent with safety considerations and in the light of local risk assessment, lights in public areas should be governed by time control switches. HEEs should encourage users to switch off lights and electrical devices when they are not required. [See Environmental Quality, Section 4, below]

Post / Mail

2.38 Arrangements for mail should be set out in the students' welcome pack or similar induction material. Personal items of mail should be received on site and there should be facilities for collection by, or distribution to, residents. Local agreements with Royal Mail may be in place for the delivery of letters and parcels. All distribution and collection details should be clearly displayed within the property. At

the end of the contract period all uncollected or undeliverable mail should be returned, as far as is practicable, to sender.

3. Maintenance and repair regimes

Approved contractors

3.1 Where an HEE is directly responsible for repairs and maintenance these should be carried out by appropriately identified HEE employed staff or external contractors from the HEE's approved list.

Response times

3.2 A service level statement (SLS) or equivalent, on reporting and rectification of building defects should be available. The SLS should set down response times in the priority categories – emergency, urgent and non urgent. (See paragraph 5.2)

Maintenance

3.3 All maintenance works should be undertaken so as to minimise inconvenience to residents. This will not always be possible with unplanned (reactive) maintenance. For planned maintenance 7 days notice should normally be given to residents; endeavours should be made to avoid sensitive periods such as examinations. For urgent work the minimum notice should be 24 hours unless an emergency requires immediate action.

Construction quality

3.4 All properties must be constructed, altered or refurbished, and maintained, in accordance with the appropriate building, planning and housing legislation. The relevant approval notices and certificates should be available for inspection by prior arrangement.

Grounds maintenance

3.5 All planting and fences around residences should be maintained to be tidy and to minimise opportunities for concealment of intruders. Principal pathways and car parks should be hard paved (or have another suitable surface) and should be illuminated appropriately for the environment.

Litter clearance

3.6 Grounds should be cleared of rubbish and litter on a regular basis as provided in the relevant service level statement, or equivalent. Students will be expected to behave responsibly and to avoid causing, or adding to, litter.

Snow and ice clearance policies

3.7 Policies on snow and ice clearance should specify expected clearance times and should be displayed in a communal area and/or on the appropriate web site.

4. Environmental Quality

Energy Efficiency

4.1 Adequate heating, hot water and ventilation should be provided, as appropriate, for each bedroom, social space, kitchen and shower/bath room. Minimum internal air temperatures and hot water temperatures should be identified in an HEE's energy management policy. Students should be encouraged to be environmentally responsible in their consumption of energy and water.

Refuse Collection

4.2 Provision must be made for the collection of all domestic refuse generated from residences. Details should be set out in a refuse management plan and notices on collection arrangements should be placed in appropriate common areas.

Recycling

4.3 Where local authority or private recycling schemes exist every effort should be made to encourage residents to take advantage of these provided it is viable to do so. Details of recycling arrangements should be contained in the HEE's environmental policy.

Car Parking

4.4 Students should be advised of car parking policies. Where relevant, arrangements regarding car parking should be set down in the HEE's transport policy. This policy should also contain information on the availability of bicycle and motor cycle parking and on public transport.

Good neighbour policy

4.5 Students should be encouraged to be mindful of the proximity of neighbours both within properties and in the wider community.

5. Landlord and tenant relationship

5A Policies and Procedures

5.1 HEEs should have clear and coherent policies and procedures in place on the relationship between managers, as landlords, and students, as tenants or licensees. These should be made available, in summary form, to all prospective residents in advance of students entering into a contractual relationship with the HEE for residential accommodation.

5.2 Policies and procedures should include information on:

- Application for, and allocation of, residential accommodation
- **Charges for accommodation:** how accommodation charges for each academic session are determined, and which body within the establishment has responsibility for setting charges
- **Collection of charges:** including any additional costs that may be incurred by a resident e.g. late payment charges, debt pursuance charges, debt arrears penalties; and any discounts that may be available and the terms under which these are offered
- Service level statements (SLSs) or equivalent: should set out such matters as cleaning schedules and response times for dealing with building defects. Student welcome packs, or similar induction material, may contain outline information on SLSs but in any event should specify where the details can be accessed by students (e.g. on a website).
- **Damage deposits** / caution fees: how any scheme operated by the HEE is administered and specifically: how much, when/how to be paid, what they are used for, and when/how balances are to be returned
- Termination and cancellation of a residential contract

- **Complaints** involving in the first instance the HEE's accommodation service, a right of appeal on unresolved issues using the establishment's complaints procedure within which there should be provision for student representation. Students should be made aware that they may, if necessary, refer complaints to external bodies including the Office of the Independent Adjudicator and the UUK Code Management Committee – see Section 8 and Annex C of this Code
- **Inventories:** availability, in each room, at the start of the period of residence
- Access to study bedrooms stipulating who has access, prior notice of entry and reasons for access
- **Defect reporting / maintenance** : defect reporting procedures including who to contact and intended timescales for rectification
- Non residents / guests: access by non-residents and/or guests

5.3 Information on the respective roles and responsibilities of the HEE and students should be readily available at the commencement and end of any contract period.

5B Communication between management and student

Advance Information

5.4 So that students may make informed decisions on their choice of accommodation HEEs should provide clear and accurate information to prospective residents. This should be as comprehensive as possible and include:

- A statement on eligibility to apply for accommodation
- Application forms appropriate to the type(s) of accommodation available
- The application process for residential accommodation
- Number of rooms available of different types
- Charges applicable to each room type and payment terms
- Length of the contract period for each room type
- Any allocations policy that may be in operation
- The terms of residency that apply including landlord and tenant/licensee obligations
- Availability, if any, of parking bays and cycle storage

Induction Briefing

5.5 HEEs should provide an induction briefing and/or issue a welcome pack or other induction literature at the beginning of occupation. This should advise students that their accommodation is covered by this Code. It should also include specific advice on issues such as health, safety (e.g. fire evacuation procedures) and welfare matters and guidance on communal living.

Management structure and contact details

5.6 At the commencement of occupancy HEEs should provide information on the management structure for residential accommodation, together with contact details of

duty officers / wardens / security staff, student representatives and also, as appropriate, any central accommodation office, maintenance office or halls office.

Insurance liabilities

5.7 HEEs should provide a statement outlining the extent of their own insurance liabilities in respect of a student's belongings and personal items.

5C Contractual Relationship

5.8 The nature of the contractual relationship between an HEE as landlord and students as tenants or licensees should be set out as clearly and concisely as possible.

Residential contract

5.9 HEEs should provide an appropriate contract which the HEE (as landlord) and the student (as tenant or licensee) will enter into.

5.10 The contract should include, or make reference to any specific terms of residency that may apply. The HEE should provide the student with a copy of the contract.

5.11 The student handbook, or similar, should set out clearly what each party can reasonably expect of each other as regards conduct, communication, behaviour and mutual respect.

6. Student Support

Welfare

6.1 HEEs should ensure that there is provision for students seeking welfare or financial advice or counselling related, in particular, to their accommodation - with reference, as appropriate, to the student union.

6.2 HEEs should ensure that there are arrangements for out of hours emergency support (e.g. through provision of personal tutors, wardens or other pastoral provision or security staff).

Health

6.3 HEEs should encourage registration with the local health service or a local GP or, where these exist, with their own medical services. They should have procedures in place to deal with notifiable diseases.

7. Anti Social Behaviour and Disciplinary Procedures

7.1 Properties should be managed so as to help prevent, or deal effectively with, any anti-social behaviour⁵ by tenants or their visitors. Where necessary, a response strategy should be prepared in liaison with the police and other agencies.

Conduct

7.2 Students should be encouraged to act in a fit and proper manner at all times and have consideration for their neighbours - both their fellow students and the local community.

Behaviour

7.3 Students should be made aware of the HEE's code of behaviour and disciplinary procedures. Any behaviour bringing the HEE's name into disrepute may be dealt with

under disciplinary procedures; other authorities may be notified of offending conduct if necessary.

Care of premises and their surroundings

7.4 Students should be encouraged to make every effort to ensure that their property and its immediate surroundings are used in a manner that retains it in the general condition of their first occupation.

8. Administration of, and compliance with, the Code

8.1 HEEs are long established, self-managing organizations. Independent governing bodies oversee their management. All establishments are subject to regular, independent, internal audit on which reports are made to governing bodies. In addition it is a requirement that establishments' independent external auditors review all aspects of their management. Findings on the quality of management are included in an HEE's annual report.

8.2 HEEs have well-established internal mechanisms for dealing with complaints from students on accommodation issues. Students may have recourse to certain external complaints procedures.

8.3 Given the existing framework of HEE management, establishments will be the primarily accountable bodies for the operation of the Code. In addition there is a need for a coordinating body and a body to oversee its operation and deal with issues concerning compliance or non-compliance with the Code. The functions of **the coordinating body (Universities UK/SCOP)** will include updating the code and drawing together establishments' reports, stakeholder feedback and other forms of monitoring. All establishments signed up to this Code are required to instruct their internal auditors to review an establishment's operation of this Code as part of their annual work. The UUK Code Managing Committee (see below) will consider cases of alleged non-compliance and may make more general provision for independent checks on compliance. If the circumstances justify such action, it may decide that an HEE is no longer compliant with the Code in respect of some or all of its student accommodation. Any such a decision would be made public. Annex D to this Code outlines the audit and compliance process.

8.4 **Universities UK/SCOP** will have overall responsibility for administering the Code of Practice. This will involve the following:

- **Maintaining a full record** of all establishments who have signed up to the Code, and the buildings covered by the Code for each establishment and ensuring that the record is publicly available.
- Liaison with ANUK to ensure satisfactory management of the dual-code arrangement in the sector this will include membership of the ANUK management committee

8.5 An independent standing committee, **the UUK/SCOP Code Managing Committee,** will have representation from relevant stakeholder groups including: university and college senior management; the Association of Colleges (AoC); specialist professions in the HE and FE sectors; the NUS; ODPM; ANUK; and local authorities. The Committee will oversee the operation of the Code and issue guidance as necessary on day to day management issues. It will conduct an **annual review** of the Code taking account of HEEs' experience, audit findings, complaints raising issues with regard to compliance with the Code and reports from other bodies (see below). In order to ensure that the Code is operated effectively and updated as appropriate, establishments will be asked to provide summary information to the Committee as follows:

- Significant complaints made by students to establishments which relate to nonobservance of the code of practice. It is suggested that "significant" in this context, refers to complaints that have escalated to a senior body within the establishment, or have been referred to the Office of the Independent Adjudicator (see Annex C).
- The relevant section of auditors' reports, management's response and the timescale for addressing auditors' recommendations.

8.6 In addition the Committee will seek reports from institutions on any complaints involving breaches of the code that have been reported directly to them or to external bodies.

8.7 Having regard to the reports of these bodies, audit reports and complaints submitted to it, the Committee will consider cases of alleged non-compliance and if necessary undertake further investigation. The Committee may make proposals to help remedy any identified defects in an HEE's management of its student accommodation. In cases of serious or persistent management failure the Committee may decide that an HEE is no longer compliant with the Code in respect of some or all of its student accommodation. In such a case the fact that a building has been removed from the Schedule must be brought to the attention of the local housing authority in whose area the building is situated.

8.8 Adoption of the Code by **an establishment** involves the following responsibilities:

- The establishment should submit to UUK a list of all the buildings which it manages or controls which are covered by the Code. This list should be updated by the establishment, and UUK notified, on an annual basis.
- These buildings should meet the standards, and accord with the procedures, set out in the Code and in relevant legislation.
- There may be some student residential accommodation which is managed and controlled by an HEE which does not comply with this Code and falls within the scope of mandatory licensing. It is a condition of accreditation within this Code that the establishment licenses this accommodation with their local authority.
- Establishments should ensure that an appropriate complaints mechanism is in place and that this mechanism is suitably integrated into wider complaints mechanisms in the institution. All such mechanisms should allow for student representation. Establishments are required (on request, in the context of periodic review of the Code) to supply, anonymised as regards student complainants, summary information to Universities UK on any significant complaints relating to the institution's operation of the Code.
- Establishments are required to ensure that their internal auditors include the establishment's management of its student accommodation in relation to the Code within the scope of their audit. Internal auditors should review an establishment's operation of this Code as part of their annual work. The relevant section of

auditors' reports, management's response and the timescale for addressing auditors' recommendations should be sent to Universities UK.

• There may be isolated cases where audit and/or complaints processes and/or local inspections reveal significant systemic failure in the management of student accommodation. In this event some or all of an establishment's buildings will be removed from the list in the Schedule to the Code; and if any or all of such buildings would otherwise be subject to mandatory licensing the establishment must seek licence(s) from the relevant local authority.

Annex A What is "managed and controlled"?

It is necessary to determine whether student accommodation is managed and controlled by an *educational establishment* or, in partnership with an HEE, by another *provider*. A method has been developed for the ANUK Code of Standards for Larger Developments for this purpose and the UUK/SCOP Code adopts that method. As noted in the Code itself (paragraph ix) this is subject to review.

The method allots points, reflecting perceived relative importance, to each element of management and control.

The elements are as follows:

Marketing – reflects who is responsible for promoting and letting the building. If the development is an underwritten or formal nomination arrangement this would clearly be the educational establishment. Informal arrangements between educational establishments and a private supplier, where the supplier is also marketing the building directly would result in marketing being undertaken by the provider. 1 point

Rent Collection – reflects who collects the rent. 1 point

Tenancy – This reflects who the student tenant signs their tenancy with, the educational establishment or another provider. This is an important matter since it sets the legal framework for the whole letting. 6 points

Hard Facilities Management (FM) – means the maintenance and replacement of the infrastructure of the building and its associated plant/equipment and buildings systems and can extend to the estate where the building is situated (including grounds and gardens). 2 points

Soft Facilities Management (FM) – means the services that are provided to the students occupying the building. There are seven questions related to aspects of those services:

Cleaning – who undertakes the cleaning, either of the residences or the communal areas? 1 point

Security – who undertakes the security, particularly out of hours security? Often this work is shared between a provider and an educational establishment, in which case points would be awarded to both. 1 point

Repairs – who undertakes any day to day repairs within the building? 1 point

Health and Safety Routines – who is responsible for health and safety routines: testing fire alarms, servicing safety equipment, undertaking a risk analysis of the building? 1 point

Out of Hours Services – who would deal with out of hours emergencies in respect of the building, for example, a power outage, a plumbing leak. This does not cover out of hours services to students offered under tenancy relations or residential cover? 1 point

Tenancy Relations – who would deal with tenant issues and support, for example, students wishing to leave, inter-tenant friction, noise and anti social behaviour, mental health problems? 2 points

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Residential Cover – who provides over night residential cover to deal with tenant issues that occur overnight? This excludes security related matters dealt with above. 1 point

The answer to the questions can be yes, responsible; no, not responsible; both are responsible.

The higher overall score determines whether an *educational establishment* or another *provider* has control and management of the building.

Whether a building is managed and controlled by an educational establishment can thus be determined by reference to the table below.

Where the number of points under "educational establishment" exceeds that of a "provider" the building is deemed to be managed and controlled by the HEE/FEE.

"Head leased" properties

Notwithstanding this calculation "head leased" properties shall not be considered "managed and controlled" by the HEE, and will therefore not be considered as being exempt from licensing. "Head leased" is defined as a small off-street property converted to accommodate 10 or fewer tenants and leased for not more than 3 years by the institution from a private provider.

Note this annex is included so as provide managers with a simplified account of the legal context for codes of practice. Some sections of the fact sheets on the Act produced by the ODPM are incorporated directly. The Annex is NOT an authoritative statement of the law.

Housing standards

- 1. The Act (Part 1) replaces the former test of "fitness" with a new system for assessing housing conditions the Housing Health and Safety Rating System (HHSRS). The system may be applied to any type of dwelling. There is no exemption for HE controlled or managed housing or, indeed, for any other category of housing.
- 2. HHSRS is an evidence-based risk assessment of risks to health and safety in residential premises. The purpose of the assessment is to provide objective information upon which local authorities can base decisions on enforcement.
- 3. HHSRS provides a rating for each of twenty nine categories of housing hazard. It does *not* provide a single rating for the dwelling as a whole or, in the case of houses in multiple occupation, for the building as a whole. The rating is expressed though a numerical score. Assessment is based on the risk to the *potential occupant who is most vulnerable to that hazard*. For example, stairs constitute a greater risk to the elderly, so for assessing hazards relating to stairs they are considered the most vulnerable group.
- 4. Action by authorities, ranging from an improvement notice to a demolition order, will be based on a three-stage consideration: (a) the hazard rating determined under HHSRS; (b) whether the authority has a duty or power to act, determined by the presence of a hazard above or below a threshold prescribed by regulations; and (c) the authority's judgement as to the most appropriate course of action to deal with the hazard.
- 5. Authorities are advised to take account of the vulnerability of the *actual* (rather than potential) occupant in deciding the best course of action.

Licensing of houses in multiple occupation (HMOs)

- 6. Part 2 of the Act is concerned with licensing of houses in multiple occupation the requirement for these to be licensed, procedures for grant or refusal of licenses and related matters. There is a new definition of a house in multiple occupation (HMO): in essence a house or flat occupied by more than one household where the households share one or more basic amenities. (Section 254) Certain categories of housing which would meet these criteria may be excluded from the definition however. Such categories are, in the terms of the Act, "excepted accommodation". (Section 254(5) and Schedule 14) see paragraphs 11ff. below.
- 7. Licensing will be mandatory for larger, higher risk HMOs, in general those of three storeys or more and occupied by five or more people comprising two or more households. This reflects the Government's policy objective of

concentrating on housing where the risk to occupants' health and safety is greatest.


- 8. The Act provides that the appropriate national authority may by order prescribe descriptions of HMOs that are to be licensed.
- 9. Part 3 of the Act provides for selective licensing. A local housing authority may make a licensing scheme providing certain conditions are met and subject to approval by the national authority. One of the conditions is: "An area is experiencing a significant and persistent problem caused by anti-social behaviour and that some or all private sector landlords in the area are not taking appropriate action to combat the problem and the LHA is satisfied the introduction of licensing, when combined with other measures taken by the LHA or in conjunction with others, will lead to a reduction or elimination of the problem".
- 10. HE accommodation excepted from general licensing provisions will be excepted also from selective licensing.

Codes of practice

- 11. The national authority may except from the definition of an HMO, for the purposes of licensing, accommodation managed and controlled by higher or further education establishments where the accommodation is used solely or principally by persons for the purpose of undertaking a full time course of further or higher education. (Section 254(5) and Schedule 14, paragraph 4). Regulations will specify "a particular educational establishment or a particular description of educational establishments" that will not be treated as HMOs.
- 12. "Exception" is on the basis that each establishment and its buildings so excepted will be managed in conformity with an approved code of practice. (Section 233). Codes set out standards of conduct and practice to be followed with regard to the management of HMOs or of accommodation excepted from the definition of HMO.
- 13. In the absence of these provisions many buildings occupied by students and managed and controlled by HEEs would be liable to licensing (paragraphs 6-10 above). The Act's provisions on housing standards however do apply to all forms of student housing (paragraphs 1-5 above).

Annex D Audit and compliance process

Within the higher education establishment

- 1. Auditors include the establishment's management of its student accommodation, in relation to this Code, within the scope of their audit.
- 2. Audit report on management of accommodation is reviewed by the governing body.
- 3. In cases where non-compliance with the Code is identified an action plan is prepared setting out how deficiencies are to be remedied

UUK/SCOP Code Management Committee

- 4. Receives, from all HEEs and FEEs signatory to this Code, the relevant section of auditors' reports, management's response and the timescale for addressing auditors' recommendations
- 5. Examines cases of non-compliance identified in auditors' reports
- 6. Receives information on complaints referred to a senior body within an HEE.
- 7. Commissions and receives reports on complaints that have been referred directly to the UUK/SCOP Code or to external bodies.

Action by the Committee

- 8. In the light of information and reports received (3-5 above) the Committee may:
 - Determine that no further action is needed
 - Make proposals to the HEE on steps to be taken to remedy identified defects in accommodation management
 - Make independent checks on compliance
 - Determine that the establishment is no longer in compliance with the Code in respect of one or more of the buildings listed in the Schedule to the Code

Schedule of Buildings to which this Code applies

The National Code of Standards for Larger Developments

for student accommodation NOT managed and controlled by educational establishments

2006

This Code establishes a set of specific standards with particular relevance to larger developments tenanted by students. The definition of "larger development" is a development where in excess of 15 students live in one building in rooms off a central corridor, in cluster flats, or in self contained flats.

Larger developments have particular needs and procedures relating to their ongoing management and this Code reflects their specialist status as an important part of the student accommodation supply.

The purpose of the National Code is to enable property owners, managers and tenants to agree a set of undertakings about how they wish to do business with one another.

This Code relates specifically to accommodation providers excluding educational establishments. In situations where accommodation is provided in partnership with an educational establishment, the determination of whether the accommodation is managed and controlled by the educational establishment is decided by the outcome of the calculations to be found in Annex 1 of the Code.

The criteria in the Code have been chosen to reflect a balance of common sense obligations and responsibilities between the managers of larger student accommodation buildings and tenants and set benchmark standards which are achievable by managers without significant expenditure of time and money and without prejudice to their respective legal rights.

Compliance with the Code will ensure that:

- Both managers and tenants enjoy the benefit of good standards of housing management and practice.
- Misunderstandings and disputes are reduced.
- Where problems do occur they are promptly resolved.

In all cases the fact that a supplier has agreed to comply with the Code will be made explicit on property advertisements and tenant information and the Code will be actively and positively promoted amongst students searching for housing.

The Code enjoys the support of the National Union of Students (NUS), Office of the Deputy Prime Minister, The Accreditation Network UK (ANUK), The Association for Student Residential Accommodation (ASRA), Chartered Institute of Environmental Health Officers (CIEH), Conference of University Business Officers (CUBO), UniversitiesUK, its secretariat is based at Unipol Student Homes. The business and service reputation of those that maintain compliance will be enhanced in contrast to those that either, choose not to operate within the Code or, fail to honour their agreement to work within it.

Adoption of the Code by an accommodation provider is **voluntary**. Making a commitment to abide by the Code is a serious matter and a failure to meet such a commitment is a breach of faith. The National Code Committee of Management undertakes a number of compliance tests for the purpose of ascertaining compliance

with the Code and tenants can complain where they feel a breach has occurred. Information showing that owners are not complying with the Code is in the public domain and will remain accessible for three years, even if the owners leaves, or is removed, from the Code.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

- 1.0 Managers will ensure that all accommodation allocation procedures comply with any existent equal opportunities policies that apply to their organisation. Where these do not exist, owners will ensure that no person or group of persons applying for accommodation will be treated less favourably than any other person or group of persons because of their race, colour, ethnic or national origin, gender, disability, appearance, age, marital status, sexual orientation or social status.
- 1.01 As part of its commitment to assist those with disabilities, it is agreed that charges for rooms adapted for use by students with disabilities do not exceed the normal room rate for that development.

MARKETING PRIOR TO LETTING PROPERTY TO TENANTS

- 2.00 All property details are reported accurately without misrepresentation to prospective tenants. This will include details provided in prospectuses, brochures and Websites. Where a development is being promoted in a University prospectus then the details will make clear if the operator of the scheme is not the University and will state clearly the management organisation charged with both tenant and building responsibilities;
- 2.01 All prospective tenants are informed about any contractual terms under which the property is offered, including those relating to any fees payable in addition to rent, such as booking fees, utility charges, deposits, insurance, Web or telephone costs;
- 2.02 Where a booking fee is charged that fee is a standard published fee for all tenants and information will be provided on: the cost of the fee, the nature of the reservation being made, arrangements for cancelling the booking and returning the fee, the point at which the fee would not be returned if a tenancy was not entered into, the manner in which the booking fee will be returned to the tenant when a tenancy is entered into. In all cases a receipt will be given to a tenant for the booking fee and the conditions of levying and returning, or not returning, that fee will be stated on that receipt;
- 2.03 No other monies for deposits or rent are demanded prior to the signing and exchange of any letting agreement;
- 2.04 All tenants are provided with a written copy of the letting agreement at the time they sign that agreement or at the time that they pay any booking fee or deposit;
- 2.05 Any contracts used do not include terms that are in breach of the Unfair Terms in Contracts Regulations 1999;
- 2.06 Where a building is new, or undergoing refurbishment and the building programme is running late and where this may result in pre-let rooms not being ready for occupancy, the manager informs the future tenant at the earliest possibility of this likelihood and its consequences for them.
- 2.07 In the event that a room is not ready for occupation on the date that the tenancy

begins then a suitable alternative room is provided, by the same supplier, in an adjacent building or, in any event, in a building within half a mile of the original development. The replacement facility must provide an equivalent level of services and amenities previously contracted for. If an alternative bed is not available on the terms above then a hotel room will be secured and any amount paid for rent during the period of temporary occupancy will be refunded to the tenant by the supplier with whom the customer signed the tenancy. If no self-catering facilities are provided in any accommodation offered then breakfast and one other meal will be provided, or arrangements for receiving these meals will be provided.

Rent Liability

Managers will ensure that:

- 2.08 Prospective tenants are issued with a clear statement of the rent due to be paid, including the dates, amounts and methods of payments due to be made during the contract;
- 2.09 Prospective tenants are issued with written receipts for all monies received, whether in payment for rent, deposit, utility or service charges. Where any transactions are undertaken in cash a written receipt will always be provided by the manager.

Contact Details for Staff

Managers will ensure that:

- 2.10 The owner of the building, their registered office and the name, address and any email address of those responsible for the management function of the building, together with a standard notice affirming membership of this Code (supplied at the time of signing) will be clearly displayed on a fixed noticeboard located either in the entrance lobby or a common facility in the development. If there is no main lobby then this will be affixed to the wall at the bottom of the main stairwell to the building;
- 2.11 The name and contact details of all staff involved in the management of the development will be provided to tenants at the commencement of their tenancy, including the times that they will be available and specifying their duties.

State of Repair

Managers will ensure that:

2.12 All tenants are provided with an up-to-date inventory of their room/flat that indicates the state of repair of fixtures and fittings at the time their tenancy commenced. If no inventory is issued, no deductions from deposits will be made at the end of the tenancy in respect of the condition of the furniture and fittings. Where a standard furniture kit is available in all rooms in a development, a list of fixtures and fittings can be provided which would allow for deposit deductions in respect of items that are found to be missing from the room at the end of the tenancy period.

DURING THE TENANCY

Ensuring Possession

3.00 Statutory notices requiring possession are served on existing tenants in order to mitigate any delay or hardship that may be caused to the manager or incoming tenants.

Access

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.01 Where access is required for routine inspections, each affected tenant receives notification of the date, time and purpose of the visit not less than 24 hours in advance, except in circumstances where issuance of such notice is impractical; and that tenant privacy and entitlement to quiet enjoyment is respected;
- 3.02 Where a building is under snagging and defects procedures being undertaken by the builder and work needs to be carried out on a regular basis tenants are informed of this and the timescale for the programme of works, in advance of those works. Where practical, the contractors and their subcontractors will be escorted by a representative of the owner to ensure that access is properly ordered and that work being undertaken is not unduly disruptive of occupants. Contractors should not enter without the permission of the tenants;
- 3.03 Business is pursued in a professional, courteous and diligent manner at all times.

Fines

Managers will ensure that:

3.04 Tenants are not subject to an internal fining system within their tenancy arrangements. Costs of any damage caused by tenants will be deducted from any deposit held or by other means sanctioned by law.

Repairs and Maintenance

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.05 Tenants are provided with information about how to report any repair/maintenance issues and to whom these should be addressed;
- 3.06 The development is maintained in a way that complies with all statutory and local authority regulations relating to HMOs and/or purpose built developments;
- 3.07 Any repair or defect works that are required meet with the following performance standards

Priority One – Emergency Repairs – are completed within 24 hours of a report of a defect. These would be any repairs required to avoid a danger to health, a risk to the safety of residents or serious damage to buildings or residents belongings;

Priority Two – Urgent Repairs – are completed within five working days of report of the defect. These would be any repairs which materially affect the comfort or convenience of the residents;

Priority Three – Non-Urgent Repairs – are completed within 28 days of a report of a defect. These would be any repairs not falling within the above categories;

3.08 Maintenance and servicing programmes, such as gas appliance servicing, window and guttering cleaning, exterior and interior painting, are carried out in

a planned and cyclical manner and with due regard to the convenience of tenants;

- 3.09 In a building with more than three floors, notice of external window cleaning and painting is given not less that 24 hours before those activities commence;
- 3.10 Where a dispute arises between the manager and tenant/s as to when a repair has been reported then the date on which the repair was reported to the manager in writing will be the accepted date;
- 3.11 Contractors will remove all redundant materials and debris from site on completion of works in a reasonable time and will behave in a professional and courteous manner at all times.

Cleaning and Maintenance of Communal Areas

Managers will ensure that:

3.12 Full details of the times for cleaning and maintaining communal areas will be provided to tenants in writing or displayed on appropriate notice boards within the development.

Furniture and Storage Space

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.13 All study bedrooms contain a bed, adequate clothes storage space, a desk, chair, and curtains which are hung properly;
- 3.14 All furnishings and furniture are clean and in reasonable condition at the commencement of the tenancy and comply with the relevant fire safety legislative requirements relating to furniture and furnishings -Furniture and Furnishings (Fire) (Safety) Regulations 1988

Kitchen Facilities

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.15 All kitchen facilities are designed and installed having regard to safety;
- 3.16 Food storage and preparation facilities comply with levels of provision laid down by the Local Authority for developments of this type;
- 3.17 Kitchens contain an adequate number of appropriately positioned plug sockets;
- 3.18 Kitchens are sited on the same level as the sleeping accommodation or have an adjacent dining or communal space where eating at a table can take place.

Toilet and Personal Washing Facilities

- 3.19 WC, bath and/or shower facilities comply with the levels of provision laid down by the Local Authority for developments of this type;
- 3.20 All WCs situated in tenants' rooms are properly compartmentalised, with adequate provision of natural or mechanical ventilation;
- 3.21 When a room is described as *en suite* this means that it has a bath/shower, wash basin and toilet which form a self contained amenity for the exclusive use of the tenant occupying that room and that this amenity is accessible without recourse to any corridor or passageway used by other occupants.

Laundry Facilities

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.22 Facilities are provided for the washing and drying of clothes. Where a launderette is provided the ratio of Washer/driers to tenants should be no greater than 1:75 and consideration should be given to the possibility of machine malfunction.
- 3.23 Where a laundrette is provided within a development and that facility is provided as an amenity in the particulars of the letting at the point of establishing a tenancy, details of the organisation responsible for the management and ownership of the laundrette are displayed and information on how to report repairs supplied to the tenants. If the facility is not accessible 24 hours a day then tenants will be informed about opening times.

Mail deliveries

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.24 Tenants are informed of procedures for the distribution of incoming mail and where it can be collected from. Tenants must be able to access their mailbox from a secure area, preferably accessible from within the building.
- 3.25 Where mail is not delivered through a letterbox into the room or flat of occupancy, then mail is delivered in conveniently located, lockable, secure, mailboxes;
- 3.26 Where the manager of the building is responsible for the distribution of mail, this is delivered on all normal Monday to Friday working days, not more than 24 hours from the time of the mail being delivered at the building. Mail received over public holidays and weekends shall be delivered not later than 24 hours after a normal working day occurs. The manager is not required to take delivery of parcels and larger items of mail, but in these circumstances notification that such items can be collected from a central depository must be given within the timescale above. Where a manager accepts parcels then notification of these items must be given to tenants within the timescale above;
 - 3.27 Tenants are informed of any mail forwarding arrangements not less than 14 days before the end of any tenancy. It is not necessary for managers to agree to forward mail but this must be made clear to tenants, in advance. Where no forwarding service is offered, undelivered mail must be returned to the sender with the notification "gone away" on each item.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Housing Health and Safety Rating System

Managers will ensure that:

4.00 In consultation with the Local Authority, buildings are maintained in compliance with the requirements of Part I of the Housing Act 2004 (see appendix 3 dealing with the Housing Health and Safety Rating System).

Gas Appliances and Supply

- 4.01 All means of use and supply of mains gas and alterations and repairs to gas installations must comply with the current Gas Safety (Installation and Use) Regulations;
- 4.02 All gas appliances are serviced annually by a Council of Registered Gas Installers (CORGI) engineer and verification of this servicing within the development/flat is provided to each tenant;
- 4.03 Clear written instructions for the safe use of all central heating and hot water systems are provided to the tenants.

Electrical Installations and Appliances

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.04 They possess a current Periodic Inspection Report (based on Appendix 6 of BS 7671) showing that all electrical installations are in satisfactory condition. The inspection must be carried out by a competent electrical engineer (preferably National Inspection Council for Electrical Installation Contracting or Electrical Contractors Association) to show that the installation is safe and satisfactory and had been tested within the last 5 years;
- 4.05 All repairs and improvements to electrical installations comply with the current edition of the Institute of Electrical Engineers Wiring Regulations and meet with BS 7671;
- 4.06 Reasonable steps are taken to ensure that all electrical appliances provided by them are functioning effectively, in accordance with manufacturers' operational instructions and in a safe manner. Portable Appliance Testing (PAT) would be one satisfactory method of ensuring this, another would be to install circuit breakers. Appliances must be regularly visually inspected for wear and tear by the managers and any defects remedied. Tenants are provided with information about how, and to whom, any defects should be reported;
- 4.07 Instructions for the safe use of all electrical appliances are provided to the tenants and isolator switches properly labelled;
- 4.08 When a room is described as having central heating, this comprises of a heater that can be controlled within the room or flat, and adjustable by a timer that allows control over a minimum 24 hour period. An electric panel heater with an on/off or booster switch that allows a preset period of use may be regarded as electric heating.

Energy Efficiency

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.09 All Developments built after 2002 are provided with a reasonable level of energy efficiency installations;
- 4.10 Tenants are given, on request, advice on how best to heat the accommodation and use hot water in an energy efficient way when using the facilities provided.

Fire Safety

Managers will ensure that:

4.11 All developments are provided with properly maintained fire safety installations, and instructions on their use, necessary to enable the tenants to

safely evacuate the building in event of a fire where this is required. These will be provided with fire safety measures in accordance with current legislation and may include by way of example:

- a fire escape route with a minimum of 30 minutes fire resistance
- an automatic fire alarm system
- an emergency lighting system sited to protect the route of escape

The design and detail of the measures are determined in accordance with a fire safety risk assessment and in consideration of the local authority's HMO standards;

- 4.12 Fire alarm and detection systems are maintained in proper working order, systems are tested regularly, and an annual inspection and test of the entire system is carried out by a suitably qualified engineer;
- 4.13 A log book or certificate is kept containing information on when the testing and inspection of the fire alarm system was carried out and by whom;
- 4.14 Documentation is available to certify that the fire alarm and emergency lighting systems have received annual checks and are in proper working condition;
- 4.15 Tenants are provided with clear written guidelines on the fire safety procedures, including details of the safety measures installed, why they are there, how they operate and what to do in the event of a fire;
- 4.16 Notices containing this information is displayed in all rooms and communal areas;
- 4.17 All exit routes within the building, such as hallways, landings and staircases, so far as they are under the control of the landlord and as far as reasonably practical, are maintained safe and unobstructed to enable evacuation of the dwelling in the event of fire.

Security Measures

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.18 External doors to the building are of strong, solid, safe construction and fitted with a secure locking system capable of being opened from the inside without use of a key (if an electronic system is installed then it will be programmed to open in event of a power failure). Door frames should be of a strong construction and well secured;
- 4.19 Any intercom entry systems should not allow access to the building without the tenant being able to establish the identity of the caller;
- 4.20 Ground floor and upper storey windows accessible from ground level are of sound construction and fitted with a lockable system capable of being opened from the inside without the use of a key. Occupants of ground floor rooms should be provided with specific security information;
- 4.21 The building has a security plan detailing an appropriate level of management to maintain security standards and this plan can, on request, be shown to tenants. The plan should also stipulate what security information will be supplied to tenants.

The Environment

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.22 All developments are provided with adequate refuse disposal facilities for the number of occupants;
- 4.23 Where waste facilities are used by more than 10 tenants then a waste disposal plan exists for the building which can be consulted by tenants, on request. Tenants must be informed, not later than 24 hours of moving into the building, of waste collection arrangements. Where the local authority operates a recycling scheme, the waste disposal plan will conform to the relevant standards for recycling refuse.
- 4.24 The perimeter of all developments and any surrounding grounds are maintained in good order and are free of waste and litter as far as is reasonably practicable;
- 4.25 Where a garden area exists this is properly maintained and not be allowed to become overgrown. The path to and from all external doors will be kept in good repair and free from obstruction;
- 4.26 Where a garden or gardens exist these are retained as soft planted areas (this includes low maintenance gravelling with planting), although paths may be added. Plants and shrubs will be properly maintained and not be allowed to obstruct the pavements or other public areas surrounding the property;
- 4.27 Hedges and bushes are kept trimmed low wherever practical to avoid providing screening for criminal activities;
- 4.28 Neighbouring residents have access to and be eligible to use the complaints procedure (7.00 and 7.01). A neighbour is defined as a resident within the same or adjacent street within 200 metres of the property.

Communal Lighting

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.29 All internal and external communal areas are provided with adequate safe lighting;
- 4.30 Where light switches are fitted with automatic timers they allow sufficient time for tenants to reach their rooms or to exit the building;
- 4.31 No more than five lamps fail on external lighting before those lamps are replaced and no more than three lamps fail on stairwells and corridors before those lamps should have been replaced.

AT THE END OF THE TENANCY

Deposits

- 5.00 Deposits, where required, are administered efficiently and reasonably and are not withheld for any purpose other than for which they are levied;
- 5.01 Tenants are issued with clear written guidelines regarding the standard of cleaning and other arrangements that will be expected when the tenancy comes to an end;
- 5.02 Subject to paragraph 5.03, deposits are returned to former tenants within four weeks of the end of the tenancy;

5.03Where monies from deposits have been retained to offset costs incurred, any remaining balance is returned within the timescale set out in paragraph 5.02 together with a written statement of account providing details of all and any deductions that have been made.

References

Managers will ensure that:

- 5.04 Following a written request from a former tenant, a reference will be provided.
- 5.05 Letters of reference are based on the performance of the named individual during the period of the tenancy only, or in the case of a joint tenancy those within the tenancy.

DISPUTES

Where disputes arise with tenants, managers will ensure that:

- 6.00 They respond reasonably and promptly to tenants or their representatives. Where a parent of a tenant is making a complaint then the tenant will confirm in writing that this constitutes their representative;
- 6.01 They make written response to any correspondence from tenants or their representatives within three weeks of its receipt;
- 6.02 Any settlements or agreements reached are honoured within three weeks of the settlement being agreed;
- 6.03 They maintain courteous professional relations with tenants during any dispute.

Complaints

Managers will ensure that:

- 7.00 Within four weeks of receipt of any written complaint from a tenant (or their representative) they rectify any breach of this Code of Standards or, where any allegations are contested, enter into correspondence with the tenants or their representative; (Appendix 2 describes the complaint resolution procedure
- 7.01 Where such a breach is contested, or where rectification is not made in accordance with 7.00 above, they recognise the authority of a Tribunal which will determine whether or not a breach of the code has occurred and make recommendations accordingly. In the event that such recommendations are not followed by the manager then they will be deemed to be in breach of the Code and this fact will be made public to prospective tenants. The Tribunal will have the authority to exclude any owner from the Code.

Data Protection

All information concerning owners/managers of developments displayed on the website in relation to complaints received under this code will comply with the principles of good practice for the handling of personal data. It will be fairly and lawfully processed, contain only adequate and relevant information about the complaint, accurately reflect the details of the complaint, remain on the website for no longer than three years, be processed in accordance with the data subject's rights, and will be held securely.

ANNEX 1

National Code of Standards for Larger Developments For student accommodation not managed and controlled by educational establishments

Determination of Whether a Development is Managed and Controlled by an Educational establishment

Many larger student accommodation developments are undertaken in partnership between a provider of services and an educational establishment. As a result of this it can be difficult to determine whether a building is being managed and controlled by the educational establishment or by the private provider. In order to discover who the building is managed and controlled by, a framework of test questions has been developed.

12 questions are asked: the answer can be yes, responsible, no, not responsible or both are responsible. The answer to each question attracts the number of points, as follows:

Marketing -	1 point
Rent Collection -	1 point
Tenancy -	6 points
Hard FM -	2 points
Soft FM	
Cleaning -	1 point
Security -	1 point
Repairs -	1 point
Health and Safety Routines - 1	point
Out of Hours Services -	1 point
Tenancy Relations -	2 points
Residential Cover -	1 point

The points are loaded to reflect the importance of each item as determining control and management.

There are a total of 18 points in all. The headings are scored according to an educational establishment or another provider. Whoever has the higher score determines who has control and management of the building.

For a worked example of the method of determination see below.

Guidelines on Questions

The term "educational establishment" means just that and "provider" means an organisation other than the educational establishment providing the duties and services.

Marketing - reflects who is responsible for promoting and letting the building. If the development is an underwritten or formal nominations arrangement this would clearly be the educational establishment. Informal arrangements between educational establishments and a private supplier, where the supplier is also marketing the building directly would result in marketing being undertaken by the provider.

Rent Collection - reflects who collects the rent.

Tenancy - This reflects who the student tenant signs their tenancy with, the educational establishment or another provider. This is an important matter since it sets the legal framework for the whole letting.

HardFM - means the maintenance and replacement of the infrastructure of the building and its associated plant/equipment and buildings systems and can extend to the estate where the building is situated (including grounds and gardens).

Soft FM - means the services that are provided to the students occupying the building. There are seven questions related to aspects of those services:

Cleaning - who undertakes the cleaning, either of the residences or the communal areas

Security - who undertakes the security, particularly out of hours security. Often this work is shared between a provider and an educational establishment, in which case points would be awarded to both

Repairs - who undertakes any day to day repairs within the building

Health and Safety Routines - who is responsible for health and safety routines: testing fire alarms, servicing safety equipment, undertaking a risk analysis of the building

Out of Hours Services - who would deal with out of hours emergencies in respect of the building, for example, a power outage, a plumbing leak. This does not cover out of hours services to students offered under tenancy relations or residential cover

Tenancy Relations - who would deal with tenant issues and support, for example, students wishing to leave, inter-tenant friction, noise and anti social behaviour, mental health problems

Residential Cover - who provides over night residential cover to deal with tenant issues that occur overnight. This excludes security related matters dealt with above.

Further guidance can be obtained from the Code Administrator at any time before applying the test questions above.





F. Chair considers the complaint and has two possible courses of action:

Chairs Ruling - Chair decides, in consultation with Vice chairs, if case is serious enough to be referred to the full tribunal. If not the Chair makes the ruling and details appear on the website

Full Tribunal – Complaint is heard by panel consisting of a maximum of nine people – Chair, two members of the consortium (at least one from NUS), three owner representatives, one person from the local authority, one person from the local student union, one person from the educational establishment (where appropriate). Owner and tenant/s will attend to state their case. Tribunal's decision will be posted on the website and remain in the public domain for three years

Appendix 3 – Housing Health and Safety Ratings System

The condition of all housing is now catered for by Part 1 of the Housing Act 2004 and the evidence based risk assessment process of the Housing Health and Safety Rating System (HHSRS), on which local authorities must now base enforcement decisions. This applies to all types of residential premises, whether or not any amenities are shared.

Following a complaint, or for any other reason, a local authority may arrange to inspect premises to determine whether a category 1 or 2 hazard exists.

HHSRS assesses twenty-nine categories of housing hazard. Technical assessment is a two-stage process, addressing first the likelihood of an occurrence and then the range of probable harm outcomes. These two factors are combined using a standard method to give a score in respect of each hazard. HHSRS does not provide a single score for the dwelling as a whole or, in the case of multiply occupied dwellings, for the building as a whole.

The scores from different hazards cannot be meaningfully aggregated. There is no strong evidential basis for aggregating hazard scores, and to attempt to do this would make far more difficult the assessment of likelihood and spread of harm of hazards. However, the presence of a number of individual category 2 hazards may be a factor in an authority's decision to take action.

Hazards are scored in bands, from band A, the most severe, to band J. The relationship between these bands and category 1 and category 2 is prescribed in the Regulations. Category 1 hazards are those rated in bands A-C. Category 2 hazards are those rated band D and lower. Category 1 hazards trigger a local authority's duty under section 5 to take the appropriate enforcement action. Category 2 hazards can be dealt with under the authority's discretionary powers, which are set out in section 7.

The 2004 Act gives local authorities powers to intervene where they consider housing conditions to be unacceptable, on the basis of the impact of health and safety hazards on the most vulnerable potential occupant. The 2004 Act puts authorities under a general duty to take appropriate action in relation to a category 1 hazard. Where they have a general duty to act, they must take the most appropriate of the following courses of action:

- serve an improvement notice in accordance with section 11
- make a prohibition order in accordance with section 20
- serve a hazard awareness notice in accordance with section 28
- take emergency remedial action under section 40 or make an emergency prohibition order under section 43
- make a demolition order under section 265 of the Housing Act 1985 as amended
- declare a clearance area by virtue of section 289 of the 1985 Act as amended.

The National Code of Standards for Larger Developments

for student accommodation managed and controlled by educational establishments

2006

Introduction

This Code is specifically designed for student accommodation that is occupied solely or principally by persons for the purpose of undertaking a full time course of further or higher education at the establishment providing the accommodation.

The Code establishes a set of standards with particular relevance to developments tenanted by students. It covers all developments managed and controlled by educational establishments except head leased properties.

Student Accommodation has particular needs and procedures relating to its ongoing management and this Code reflects this.

The purpose of the National Code is to enable educational establishments and students to agree a transparent and useful set of undertakings about how they wish to do business with one another.

The criteria in the Code have been chosen to reflect a balance of common sense obligations and responsibilities between the managers of student accommodation and tenants and set benchmark standards which are achievable by managers without significant expenditure of time and money and without prejudice to their respective legal rights.

Compliance with the Code will ensure that:

- Both managers and tenants enjoy the benefit of good standards of housing management and practice.
- Misunderstandings and disputes are reduced.
- Where problems do occur they are promptly resolved.

In all cases the fact that an educational establishment has agreed to comply with the Code will be made explicit on letting and marketing materials and tenant information and the Code will be actively and positively promoted amongst students.

The Code enjoys the support of the National Union of Students (NUS), the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister, The Accreditation Network UK (ANUK), the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health Officers (CIEH), and UniversitiesUK, its secretariat is based at Unipol Student Homes. The customer service reputation of those that maintain compliance will be enhanced in contrast to those that either choose not to operate within such a Code or fail to honour their agreement to work within it.

Adoption of the Code by an establishment is entirely **voluntary**. Making a commitment to abide by the Code is a serious matter and a failure to meet such a commitment is a breach of faith. The National Code Committee of Management undertakes a number of verification and compliance tests for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with the Code and tenants can complain where they feel a breach has occurred.

Determination of Whether a Development is Managed and Controlled by an Educational Establishment

Many student accommodation developments are undertaken in partnership between a provider of services and an educational establishment. In order to determine whether a building is managed and controlled by an educational establishment, a framework of test questions has been developed.

The answer to each question attracts a number of points. The points are loaded to reflect the importance of each item as determining control and management. For the purposes of determining eligibility to sign this particular Code, the educational establishment must have the higher score.

The scoring system and guidelines for answering the questions can be found in annex 1 at the end of the Code.

Head Leased Properties

Head leased properties are defined as off street properties converted to accommodate 10 or less tenants and leased for not more than 3 years by an educational establishment from a private landlord.

Legislative Implications

By agreeing to abide by this Code, educational establishments may be exempt from HMO Licensing under the Housing Act 2004, subject to Regulations made under paragraph 4 of Schedule 14 of the Housing Act 2004.

Section 233 of the Housing Act 2004 provides that the appropriate national authority (the Secretary of State in England or The National Assembly for Wales) may by order approve a code of practice (whether prepared by that authority or another person) laying down standards of conduct and practice to be followed with regard to the management of houses in multiple occupation or of accommodation excepted from the definition of HMO for all purposes of the Housing Act 2004 other than Part 1. Approval of a code under Section 233 of the Housing Act 2004 does not have the effect of making a breach of that code an offence nor does breach create a civil liability. However, the code may be used as evidence of good practice by a court or tribunal. The Code itself in no way compromises any legal action that either the tenant or the educational establishment may wish to take separately: it provides an additional voluntary layer of rights and responsibilities.

There is a discretion for the appropriate national authority to exclude from the definition of an HMO, for the purposes of licensing, a university or other higher education establishment-managed or controlled accommodation (under section 254(5) and Schedule 14, paragraph 4 of that Act. They may be excluded on the basis that each establishment and its buildings so excluded would be managed in conformity with a code of practice approved under section 233.

This is a code which, subject to approval under section 233, is intended to apply to student accommodation managed or controlled by educational establishments that may be excepted from the definition of HMO for all purposes of the Housing Act 2004 other than Part 1.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

- 2.0 Managers will ensure that all accommodation allocation procedures comply with any existent equal opportunities policies that apply to their educational establishment. Where these do not exist, the educational establishment will ensure that no person or group of persons applying for accommodation will be treated less favourably than any other person or group of persons because of their race, colour, ethnic or national origin, gender, disability, appearance, age, marital status, sexual orientation or social status.
- 1.01 As part of its commitment to assist those with disabilities, it is agreed that charges for rooms adapted for use by students with disabilities do not exceed the normal room rate for that development.

MARKETING PRIOR TO LETTING PROPERTY TO TENANTS

- 2.00 All property details are reported accurately without misrepresentation to prospective tenants. This will include details provided in prospectuses, brochures and Websites;
- 2.01 All prospective tenants are informed about any contractual terms under which the property is offered, including those relating to any fees payable in addition to rent, such as booking fees, utility charges, deposits, insurance, Web or telephone costs;
- 2.02 Where a booking fee is charged that fee is a standard published fee for all tenants and information will be provided on: the cost of the fee, the nature of the reservation being made, arrangements for cancelling the booking and returning the fee, the point at which the fee would not be returned if a tenancy was not entered into, the manner in which the booking fee will be returned to the tenant when a tenancy is entered into. In all cases a receipt will be given to a tenant for the booking fee and the conditions of levying and returning, or not returning, that fee will be stated on that receipt;
- 2.03 No other monies for deposits or rent are demanded prior to the signing and exchange of any letting agreement;
- 2.04 All tenants are provided with a written copy of the letting agreement at the time they sign that agreement or at the time that they pay any booking fee or deposit;
- 2.05 Any contracts used do not include terms that are in breach of the Unfair Terms in Contracts Regulations 1999;
- 2.08 Where a building is new, or undergoing refurbishment and the building programme is running late and where this may result in pre-let rooms not being ready for occupancy, the manager informs the future tenant at the earliest possibility of this likelihood and its consequences for them;
- 2.09 In the event that a room is not ready for occupation on the date that the tenancy begins then a suitable alternative room is provided, by the educational establishment, in an adjacent building or, in any event, in a building within half a mile of the original development. The replacement facility must provide an

equivalent level of services and amenities previously contracted for. If an alternative room is not available on the terms above then a hotel room will be secured and any amount paid for rent during the period of temporary occupancy will be refunded to the tenant by the educational establishment. If no self-catering facilities are provided in any accommodation offered then breakfast and one other meal will be provided, or arrangements for receiving these meals will be provided.

Rent Liability

Managers will ensure that:

- 2.08 Prospective tenants are issued with a clear statement of the rent due to be paid, including the dates, amounts and methods of payments due to be made during the contract;
- 2.09 Prospective tenants are issued with written receipts for all monies received, whether in payment for rent, deposit, utility or service charges. Where any transactions are undertaken in cash a written receipt will always be provided by the manager.

Contact Details for Staff and Student Care

Managers will ensure that:

- 2.10 the name, address and any email address of those responsible for the management function of the building, together with a standard notice affirming membership of this Code (supplied at the time of signing) will be clearly displayed on a fixed notice board located either in the entrance lobby or a common facility in the development. If there is no main lobby then this will be affixed to the wall at the bottom of the main stairwell to the building;
- 2.11 The name and contact details of all staff involved in the management of the development will be provided to tenants at the commencement of their tenancy, including the times that they will be available and specifying their duties.

Student care is an important part of the care package supplied to students by educational establishments. The establishment will ensure that:

- 2.12 A residential presence will be maintained in any development which houses in excess of 150 students and, where the development is larger there will be a minimum ratio of 1 residential presence for every 250 student occupants;
- 2.13 The residential presence can be a member of staff, or maybe a student, living in the premises for the period of a normal student tenancy.
- 2.14 Staff have a clear understanding of what their role is and what their duties are. Those details will have been provided to them at the point of engaging with those duties either in the form of a job description, personal specification or an agreement between the educational establishment and the person concerned. Those duties will also be made clear to student residents living within the building.
- 2.15 Staff receive at least 1 day structured training prior to commencing their responsibilities and establishments should ensure that this training includes information on who to contact in other agencies, statutory services and resources within the establishment itself. Also included in the training should be

information about anti-social behaviour: how to identify it, respond to it and refer issues to others who can deal with this.

2.16 Staff have access to back-up from on-call staff in the event of a significant emergency and are provided with names and contact numbers of those staff.

State of Repair

Managers will ensure that:

2.17 All tenants are provided with an up-to-date inventory of their room/flat that indicates the state of repair of fixtures and fittings at the time their tenancy commenced. If no inventory is issued, no deductions from deposits will be made at the end of the tenancy in respect of the condition of the furniture and fittings. Where a standard furniture kit is available in all rooms in a development, a list of fixtures and fittings can be provided which would allow for deposit deductions in respect of items that are found to be missing from the room at the end of the tenancy period.

DURING THE TENANCY

Ensuring Possession

Managers will ensure that:

3.00 Statutory notices requiring possession are served on existing tenants in order to mitigate any delay or hardship that may be caused to the manager or incoming tenants.

Access

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.01 Where access is required for routine inspections, each affected tenant receives notification of the date, time and purpose of the visit not less than 24 hours in advance, except in circumstances where issuance of such notice is impractical; and that tenant privacy and entitlement to quiet enjoyment is respected;
- 3.02 Where a building is under snagging and defects procedures being undertaken by the builder and work needs to be carried out on a regular basis tenants are informed of this and the timescale for the programme of works, in advance of those works. Where practical, the contractors and their subcontractors will be escorted by a representative of the educational establishment to ensure that access is properly ordered and that work being undertaken is not unduly disruptive of occupants. Contractors should not enter without the permission of the tenants;
- 3.06 Business is pursued in a professional, courteous and diligent manner at all times.

Fines

Managers will ensure that:

Tenants are not subject to an internal fining system within their tenancy arrangements. Costs of any damage caused by tenants will be deducted from any deposit held or by other means sanctioned by law.

Repairs and Maintenance

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.07 Tenants are provided with information about how to report any repair/maintenance issues and to whom these should be addressed;
- 3.06 The development is maintained in a way that complies with all statutory and local authority regulations relating to HMOs and/or purpose built developments;
- 3.07 Any repair or defect works that are required meet with the following performance standards

Priority One – Emergency Repairs – are completed within 24 hours of a report of a defect. These would be any repairs required to avoid a danger to health, a risk to the safety of residents or serious damage to buildings or residents belongings;

Priority Two – Urgent Repairs – are completed within five working days of report of the defect. These would be any repairs which materially affect the comfort or convenience of the residents;

Priority Three – Non-Urgent Repairs – are completed within 28 days of a report of a defect. These would be any repairs not falling within the above categories;

- 3.08 Maintenance and servicing programmes, such as gas appliance servicing, window and guttering cleaning, exterior and interior painting, are carried out in a planned and cyclical manner and with due regard to the convenience of tenants;
- 3.09 In a building with more than three floors, notice of external window cleaning and painting is given not less that 24 hours before those activities commence;
- 3.10 Where a dispute arises between the manager and tenant/s as to when a repair has been reported then the date on which the repair was reported to the manager in writing will be the accepted date;
- 3.13 Contractors will remove all redundant materials and debris from site on completion of works in a reasonable time and will behave in a professional and courteous manner at all times.

Cleaning and Maintenance of Communal Areas

Managers will ensure that:

3.14 Full details of the times for cleaning and maintaining communal areas are provided to tenants in writing or displayed on appropriate notice boards within the development.

Furniture and Storage Space

- 3.13 All study bedrooms contain a bed, adequate clothes storage space, a desk, chair, and curtains which are hung properly;
- 3.14 All furnishings and furniture are clean and in reasonable condition at the commencement of the tenancy and comply with the relevant fire safety legislative requirements relating to furniture and furnishings Furniture and Furnishings (Fire) (Safety) Regulations 1988.

Kitchen Facilities

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.15 All kitchen facilities are designed and installed having regard to safety;
- 3.16 Food storage and preparation facilities comply with levels of provision laid down by the Local Authority for developments of this type;
- 3.17 Kitchens contain an adequate number of appropriately positioned plug sockets;
- 3.18 Kitchens are sited on the same level as the sleeping accommodation or have an adjacent dining or communal space where eating at a table can take place;.

Toilet and Personal Washing Facilities

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.19 WC, bath and/or shower facilities comply with the levels of provision laid down by the Local Authority for developments of this type;
- 3.20 All WCs situated in tenants' rooms are properly compartmentalised, with adequate provision of natural or mechanical ventilation;
- 3.21 When a room is described as *en suite* this means that it has a bath/shower, wash basin and toilet which form a self contained amenity for the exclusive use of the tenant occupying that room and that this amenity is accessible without recourse to any corridor or passageway used by other occupants.

Laundry Facilities

Managers will ensure that:

- 3.22 Facilities are provided for the washing and drying of clothes. Where a launderette is provided the ratio of Washer/driers to tenants should be no greater than 1:75 and consideration should be given to the possibility of machine malfunction.
- 3.23 Where a laundrette is provided within a development and that facility is provided as an amenity in the particulars of the letting at the point of establishing a tenancy, details of the organisation responsible for the management and ownership of the laundrette are displayed and information on how to report repairs supplied to the tenants. If the facility is not accessible 24 hours a day then tenants will be informed about opening times.

Mail deliveries

- 3.24 Tenants are informed of procedures for the distribution of incoming mail and where it can be collected from. Tenants must be able to access their mailbox from a secure area, preferably accessible from within the building.
- 3.25 Where mail is not delivered through a letterbox into the room or flat of occupancy, then mail is delivered in conveniently located, lockable, secure, mailboxes;
- 3.26 Where the manager of the building is responsible for the distribution of mail, this is delivered on all normal Monday to Friday working days, not more than 24 hours from the time of the mail being delivered at the building. Mail received over public holidays and weekends must be delivered not later than 24 hours

after a normal working day occurs. The manager is not required to take delivery of parcels and larger items of mail, but in these circumstances notification that such items can be collected from a central depository must be given within the timescale above. Where a manager accepts parcels then notification of these items must be given to tenants within the timescale above;

3.27 Tenants are informed of any mail forwarding arrangements not less than 14 days before the end of any tenancy. It is not necessary for managers to agree to forward mail but this must be made clear to tenants, in advance. Where no forwarding service is offered, undelivered mail must be returned to the sender with the notification "gone away" on each item.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Housing Health and Safety Rating System

Managers will ensure that:

4.00 In consultation with the Local Authority, buildings are maintained in compliance with the requirements of Part I of the Housing Act 2004 (see appendix 3 dealing with the Housing Health and Safety Rating System)

Gas Appliances and Supply

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.01 All means of use and supply of mains gas and alterations and repairs to gas installations must comply with the current Gas Safety (Installation and Use) Regulations;
- 4.02 All gas appliances are serviced annually by a Council of Registered Gas Installers (CORGI) engineer and verification of this servicing within the development/flat is provided to each tenant;
- 4.03 Clear written instructions for the safe use of all central heating and hot water systems are provided to the tenants.

Electrical Installations and Appliances

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.04 They possess a current Periodic Inspection Report (based on Appendix 6 of BS 7671) showing that all electrical installations are in satisfactory condition. The inspection must be carried out by a competent electrical engineer (preferably National Inspection Council for Electrical Installation Contracting or Electrical Contractors Association) to show that the installation is safe and satisfactory and had been tested within the last 5 years;
- 4.05 All repairs and improvements to electrical installations comply with the current edition of the Institute of Electrical Engineers Wiring Regulations and meet with BS 7671;
- 4.06 Reasonable steps are taken to ensure that all electrical appliances provided by them are functioning effectively, in accordance with manufacturers' operational instructions, and in a safe manner. Portable Appliance Testing (PAT) would be one satisfactory method of ensuring this, another would be to install circuit breakers. Appliances must be regularly visually inspected for wear and tear by

the managers and any defects remedied. Tenants are provided with information about how, and to whom, any defects should be reported;

- 4.07 Instructions for the safe use of all electrical appliances are provided to the tenants and isolator switches properly labelled;
- 4.08 When a room is described as having central heating, this comprises of a heater that can be controlled within the room or flat, adjustable by a timer that allows control over a minimum 24 hour period. An electric panel heater with an on/off or booster switch that allows a preset period of use may be regarded as electric heating.

Energy Efficiency

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.09 All Developments built before 2002 are provided with a reasonable level of energy efficiency installations;
- 4.10 Tenants are given, on request, advice on how best to heat the accommodation and use hot water in an energy efficient way when using the facilities provided.

Fire Safety

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.11 All developments are provided with properly maintained fire safety installations, and instructions for their use, necessary to enable the tenants to safely evacuate the building in event of a fire where this is required. These will be provided with fire safety measures in accordance with current legislation and may include by way of example:
 - a fire escape route with a minimum of 30 minutes fire resistance
 - an automatic fire alarm system
 - an emergency lighting system sited to protect the route of escape

The design and detail of the measures are determined in accordance with a fire safety risk assessment and in consideration of the local authority's HMO standards;

- 4.12 Fire alarm and detection systems are maintained in proper working order, systems are tested regularly, and an annual inspection and test of the entire system is carried out by a suitably qualified engineer;
- 4.13 A log book or certificate is kept containing information on when the testing and inspection of the fire alarm system was carried out and by whom;
- 4.14 Documentation is available to certify that the fire alarm and emergency lighting systems have received annual checks and are in proper working condition;
- 4.15 Tenants are provided with clear written guidelines on the fire safety procedures, including details of the safety measures installed, why they are there, how they operate and what to do in the event of a fire;
- 4.16 Notices containing this information is displayed in all rooms and communal areas;
- 4.17 All exit routes within the building, such as hallways, landings and staircases, so far as they are under the control of the landlord and as far as reasonably

practical, are maintained safe and unobstructed to enable evacuation of the dwelling in the event of fire.

Security Measures

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.18 External doors to the building are of strong, solid, safe construction and fitted with a secure locking system capable of being opened from the inside without use of a key (if an electronic system is installed then it will be programmed to open in event of a power failure). Door frames should be of a strong construction and well secured;
- 4.19 Any intercom entry systems prevents access to the building without the tenant being able to establish the identity of the caller;
- 4.20 Ground floor and upper storey windows accessible from ground level are of sound construction and fitted with a lockable system capable of being opened from the inside without the use of a key. Occupants of ground floor rooms will be provided with specific security information;
- 4.21 The building has a security plan detailing an appropriate level of management to maintain security standards and this plan can, on request, be shown to tenants. The plan should also stipulate what security information will be supplied to tenants.

The Environment

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.22 All developments are provided with adequate refuse disposal facilities for the number of occupants;
- 4.23 Where waste facilities are used by more than 10 tenants then a waste disposal plan exists for the building which can be consulted by tenants, on request. Tenants must be informed, not later than 24 hours of moving into the building, of waste collection arrangements. Where the local authority operates a recycling scheme, the waste disposal plan will conform to the relevant standards for recycling refuse.
- 4.24 The perimeter of all developments and any surrounding grounds are maintained in good order and are free of waste and litter as far as is reasonably practicable;
- 4.25 Where a garden area exists this is properly maintained and not be allowed to become overgrown. The path to and from all external doors will be kept in good repair and free from obstruction;
- 4.26 Where a garden or gardens exist these are retained as soft planted areas (this includes low maintenance gravelling with planting), although paths may be added. Plants and shrubs will be properly maintained and not be allowed to obstruct the pavements or other public areas surrounding the property;
- 4.27 Hedges and bushes are kept trimmed low wherever practical to avoid providing screening for criminal activities;
- 4.28 Neighbouring residents have access to and are eligible to use the complaints procedure (7.00 and 7.01). A neighbour is defined as a resident within the same or adjacent street within 200 metres of the property.

Communal Lighting

Managers will ensure that:

- 4.29 All internal and external communal areas are provided with adequate safe lighting;
- 4.30 Where light switches are fitted with automatic timers they allow sufficient time for tenants to reach their rooms or to exit the building before switching off;
- 4.31 No more than five lamps fail on external lighting before those lamps are replaced and no more than three lamps fail on stairwells and corridors before those lamps should have been replaced.

AT THE END OF THE TENANCY

Deposits

Managers will ensure that:

- 5.00 Deposits, where required, are administered efficiently and reasonably and are not withheld for any purpose other than for which they are levied;
- 5.01 Tenants are issued with clear written guidelines regarding the standard of cleaning and other arrangements that will be expected when the tenancy comes to an end;
- 5.02 Subject to paragraph 5.03, deposits are returned to former tenants within four weeks of the end of the tenancy;
- 5.04Where monies from deposits have been retained to offset costs incurred, any remaining balance is returned within the timescale set out in paragraph 5.02 together with a written statement of account providing details of all and any deductions that have been made.

References

Managers will ensure that:

- 5.04 Following a written request from a former tenant, a reference will be provided.
- 5.05 Letters of reference are based on the performance of the named

individual during the period of the tenancy only, or in the case of a joint tenancy those within the tenancy.

DISPUTES

Where disputes arise with tenants, managers will ensure that:

- 6.00 They respond reasonably and promptly to tenants or their representatives. Where a parent of a tenant is making a complaint then the tenant will confirm in writing that this constitutes their representative;
- 6.01 They make written response to any correspondence from tenants or their representatives within three weeks of its receipt;
- 6.02 Any settlements or agreements reached are honoured within three weeks of the settlement being agreed;

6.03 They maintain courteous professional relations with tenants during any dispute.

Complaints

Managers will ensure that:

- 7.00 Within four weeks of receipt of any written complaint from a tenant (or their representative) they rectify any breach of this Code of Standards or, where any allegations are contested, enter into correspondence with the tenants or their representative; (Appendix 2 describes the complaints resolution procedure)
- 7.01 Where such a breach is contested, or where rectification is not made in accordance with 7.00 above, they recognise the authority of a Tribunal which will determine whether or not a breach of the code has occurred and make recommendations accordingly. In the event that such recommendations are not followed by the manager then they will be deemed to be in breach of the Code and this fact will be made public to prospective tenants. The Tribunal will have the authority to exclude any owner from the Code.

Data Protection

All information concerning educational establishments operating developments displayed on the website in relation to complaints received under this code will comply with the principles of good practice for the handling of personal data. It will be fairly and lawfully processed, contain only adequate and relevant information about the complaint, accurately reflect the details of the complaint, remain on the website for no longer than three years, be processed in accordance with the data subject's rights, and will be held securely.

ANNEX 1

National Code of Standards for Larger Developments

For student accommodation managed and controlled by educational establishments

Determination of Whether a Development is Managed and Controlled by an Educational establishment

Many larger student accommodation developments are undertaken in partnership between a provider of services and an educational establishment. In order to determine whether a building is managed and controlled by an educational establishment, a framework of test questions has been developed.

12 questions are asked: the answer can be yes, responsible, no, not responsible or both are responsible. The answer to each question attracts the number of points, as follows:

Marketing -	1 point
Rent Collection -	1 point
Tenancy -	6 points
Hard FM -	2 points
Soft FM	
Cleaning -	1 point
Security -	1 point
Repairs -	1 point
Health and Safety Routines - 1	point
Out of Hours Services -	1 point
Tenancy Relations -	2 points
Residential Cover -	1 point

The points are loaded to reflect the importance of each item as determining control and management.

There are a total of 18 points in all. The headings are scored according to an educational establishment or another provider. Whoever has the higher score determines who has control and management of the building. For the purposes of determining eligibility to sign this particular Code, the educational establishment must have the higher score.

For a worked example of the method of determination see below.

Guidelines on Questions

The term "educational establishment" means just that and "provider" means an organisation other than the educational establishment providing the duties and services.

Marketing - reflects who is responsible for promoting and letting the building. If the development is an underwritten or formal nominations arrangement this would clearly be the educational establishment. Informal arrangements between educational

establishments and a private supplier, where the supplier is also marketing the building directly would result in marketing being undertaken by the provider.

Rent Collection - reflects who collects the rent.

Tenancy - This reflects who the student tenant signs their tenancy with, the educational establishment or another provider. This is an important matter since it sets the legal framework for the whole letting.

HardFM - means the maintenance and replacement of the infrastructure of the building and its associated plant/equipment and buildings systems and can extend to the estate where the building is situated (including grounds and gardens).

Soft FM - means the services that are provided to the students occupying the building. There are seven questions related to aspects of those services:

Cleaning - who undertakes the cleaning, either of the residences or the communal areas

Security - who undertakes the security, particularly out of hours security. Often this work is shared between a provider and an educational establishment, in which case points would be awarded to both

Repairs - who undertakes any day to day repairs within the building

Health and Safety Routines - who is responsible for health and safety routines: testing fire alarms, servicing safety equipment, undertaking a risk analysis of the building

Out of Hours Services - who would deal with out of hours emergencies in respect of the building, for example, a power outage, a plumbing leak. This does not cover out of hours services to students offered under tenancy relations or residential cover

Tenancy Relations - who would deal with tenant issues and support, for example, students wishing to leave, inter-tenant friction, noise and anti social behaviour, mental health problems

Residential Cover - who provides over night residential cover to deal with tenant issues that occur overnight. This excludes security related matters dealt with above.

Further guidance can be obtained from the Code Administrator at any time before applying the test questions above.

Head leased properties, defined as small off street properties converted to accommodate 10 or less tenants and leased for not more than 3 years by an educational establishment from a private landlord, shall not be considered as being managed and controlled by the HEE and therefore will not be exempted from licensing.

This method of ascertaining management and control of a building has been adopted by both ANUK and UUK in order to provide a consistent and sensitive gateway that allows only educational establishments who both control and manage buildings to sign this or the UUK Code. The criteria will be reviewed periodically in the light of experience and more comprehensive guidelines will be issued where problem areas become apparent.





F. Chair considers the complaint and has two possible courses of action:

Chairs Ruling - Chair decides, in consultation with Vice chairs, if case is serious enough to be referred to the full tribunal. If not the Chair makes the ruling and details appear on the website

Full Tribunal – Complaint is heard by panel consisting of a maximum of nine people – Chair, two members of the consortium (at least one from the National Union of Students), three owner representatives, one person from the local authority, one person from the local student union, one person from the educational establishment (where appropriate). Owner and tenant/s will attend to state their case. Tribunal's decision will be posted on the website and remain in the public domain for three years

Appendix 3 – Housing Health and Safety Ratings System

The condition of all housing is now subject to Part 1 of the Housing Act 2004 and the evidence based risk assessment process of the Housing Health and Safety Rating System (HHSRS), on which local authorities must now base enforcement decisions. This applies to all types of residential premises, whether or not any amenities are shared.

Following a complaint, or for any other reason, a local authority may arrange to inspect premises to determine whether a category 1 or 2 hazard exists.

HHSRS assesses twenty-nine categories of housing hazard. Technical assessment is a two-stage process, addressing first the likelihood of an occurrence and then the range of probable harm outcomes. These two factors are combined using a standard method to give a score in respect of each hazard. HHSRS does not provide a single score for the dwelling as a whole or, in the case of multiply occupied dwellings, for the building as a whole.

The scores from different hazards cannot be meaningfully aggregated. There is no strong evidential basis for aggregating hazard scores, and to attempt to do this would make far more difficult the assessment of likelihood and spread of harm of hazards. However, the presence of a number of individual category 2 hazards may be a factor in an authority's decision to take action.

Hazards are scored in bands, from band A, the most severe, to band J. The relationship between these bands and category 1 and category 2 is prescribed in Regulations made under the Act. Category 1 hazards are those rated in bands A-C. Category 2 hazards are those rated band D and lower. Category 1 hazards trigger a local authority's duty under section 5 to take the appropriate enforcement action. Category 2 hazards can be dealt with under the authority's discretionary powers, which are set out in section 7.

The 2004 Act gives local authorities powers to intervene where they consider housing conditions to be unacceptable, on the basis of the impact of health and safety hazards on the most vulnerable potential occupant. The 2004 Act puts authorities under a general duty to take appropriate action in relation to a category 1 hazard. Where they have a general duty to act, they must take the most appropriate of the following courses of action:

- serve an improvement notice in accordance with section 11
- make a prohibition order in accordance with section 20
- serve a hazard awareness notice in accordance with section 28
- take emergency remedial action under section 40 or make an emergency prohibition order under section 43
- make a demolition order under section 265 of the Housing Act 1985 as amended
- declare a clearance area by virtue of section 289 of the 1985 Act as amended.
