#### EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO

# THE SAFETY OF SPORTS GROUNDS (DESIGNATION) (No.2) ORDER 2008 2008 No. 1644

#### 1. Introduction

1.1. This explanatory memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Culture, Media and Sport and is laid before Parliament by Command of Her Majesty.

# 2. Description

2.1. This order designates the Parc Y Scarlets occupied by Llanelli Scarlets and Llanelli Rugby Football Club and the Weston Homes Community Stadium occupied by Colchester United Football Club as sports grounds requiring safety certificates under the Safety of Sports Grounds Act 1975.

# 3. Matters of special interest to the Joint Committee on Statutory Instruments

3.1. None.

## 4. Legislative Background

- 4.1. The Safety of Sports Grounds Act 1975 provides for local authorities to issue safety certificates for designated sports grounds. Safety certificates contain such terms and conditions as the local authority considers necessary or expedient to secure reasonable safety at the sports ground. The Act creates offences in relation to the admission of spectators to a designated sports ground, in particular, where no safety certificate is in place or where the conditions of the safety certificate have been contravened.
- 4.2. Section 1(1) of the 1975 Act provides that the Secretary of State may by order designate as a sports ground requiring a safety certificate any sports ground which in his opinion has accommodation for more than 10,000 spectators.
- 4.3. The Safety of Sports Grounds (Accommodation of Spectators) Order 1996 (SI 1996/499) reduced the number of spectators to 5,000 in respect of sports grounds in England and Wales at which association football matches are played and which are occupied by a club which is a member of the FA Premier League or the Football League.
- 4.4. This order designates one football ground and one rugby ground. Similar designation orders have been issued in most years since 1976 in respect of other sports grounds.

### 5. Territorial Extent and Application

5.1 The Safety of Sports Grounds Act 1975 (under which the order is made) extends to England, Wales and Scotland.

## 6. The European Convention on Human Rights

As the instrument is subject to negative resolution procedure and does not amend primary legislation, no statement is required.

# 7. Policy background

- 7.1. The policy background to the 1975 Act is to improve spectator safety at sports grounds. The primary responsibility for ensuring safety lies with local authorities.
- 7.2. The reasons for designating these grounds as sports grounds requiring a safety certificate are: Parc Y Scarlets (the home ground of both Llanelli Scarlets and the Llanelli Rugby Football Club) is a newly built stadium and has a capacity of 15,000. Weston Homes Community Stadium, Colchester (the home ground of Colchester United Football Club) is also a newly built stadium that the club will be using as their home ground from the 26th July 2008. The new ground will have a capacity of no more than 10,000 spectators. In each case, the club and the relevant local authority, police and fire services have been consulted and no objections have been raised to designation.

### 8. Impact

- 8.1. A full Regulatory Impact Assessment has not been prepared for this order.
- 8.2. The order imposes additional requirements on the local authorities in whose areas these sports grounds are located, which will be responsible for issuing safety certificates.
