**The Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for
Registration and Fees) Amendment Regulations 2008**

Made - - - - *12th November 2008*
Laid before Parliament *19th November 2008*
Coming into force - - *1st January 2009*

The Secretary of State and the Minister of Health, Social Services and Public Safety, acting jointly, make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 75(1), 76(1) and (2) and 129(1) and (5) of the Medicines Act 1968(1).

In the case of the Minister, the powers conferred by those provisions are now vested in the Minister(2).

In accordance with section 129(6) of that Act, they have consulted such organisations as appear to them to be representative of interests likely to be substantially affected by the Regulations.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for Registration and Fees) Amendment Regulations 2008 and come into force on 1st January 2009.

Amendment of the Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for Registration and Fees) Regulations 1973

2. In regulation 3 (fees) of the Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for Registration and Fees) Regulations 1973(3)—

- (a) in paragraph (1), for “£510” (fee for registration of premises, where premises are in Great Britain) substitute “£529”;

The word “prescribed,” which is also relevant to the powers being exercised, is defined in section 132(1) of the Act.

(2) By virtue of section 95(5) of, and paragraph 10 of Schedule 12 to, the Northern Ireland Act 1998 (c.47) the Department for which the Minister is responsible was renamed by virtue of Article 3(6) of S.I. 1999/283 (N.I. 1).

(3) S.I. 1973/1822; the relevant amending instruments are S.I. 1980/1806 and S.I. 2007/3282.

- (b) in paragraph (2), for “£162” (retention fee, where premises are in Great Britain) substitute “£168”; and
- (c) in paragraph (3), for “£510” (additional sum by way of penalty, where premises are in Great Britain) substitute “£529”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations further amend the Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for Registration and Fees) Regulations 1973 as follows—

- (a) regulation 2(a) increases the fee for registration of premises at which a retail pharmacy business is, or is to be, carried on by 3.7% where the premises are in Great Britain;
- (b) regulation 2(b) increases the retention fee by 3.7% where the premises are in Great Britain; and
- (c) regulation 2(c) increases the penalty for failure to pay a retention fee (payable in the circumstances specified in section 76(2) of the Medicines Act 1968) by 3.7% where the premises are in Great Britain.
