EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO

THE SURFACE WATERS (FISHLIFE) (CLASSIFICATION) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2009

2009 No. 1264

1. This explanatory memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and is laid before Parliament by Command of Her Majesty.

2. Purpose of the instrument

2.1 The Fresh Water Fish Directive (78/659/EEC) was implemented in England and Wales by The Surface Waters (Fishlife) (Classification) Regulations 1997 (S.I. 1997/1331). In 2006 the European Commission reviewed the Directive to consolidate the amendments which had been made to the Directive since the 1970s. The review process produced a new version of the Directive (2006/44/EC), but made no changes to the substance of it. The purpose of this instrument is to incorporate this change into domestic legislation.

4. Legislative Context

4.1 The Regulation updates the reference to the revised Fresh Water Fish Directive (2006/44/EC).

5. Territorial Extent and Application

5.1 This instrument applies to England and Wales.

5.2 Directive 2006/44/EC is implemented in Scotland by The Surface Waters (Fishlife) (Classification) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2007 (no 178).

6. European Convention on Human Rights

As the instrument is subject to negative resolution procedure and does not amend primary legislation, no statement is required.

7. Policy background

• What is being done and why

7.1 The Surface Waters (Fishlife) (Classification) Regulations 1997 are being amended to reflect the codification of Council Directive 78/659/EEC and its amendments into a single text now contained in Directive 2006/44/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council (OJ No L 264, 25.09.2006, p 20). There is no change to policy.

• Consolidation

7.2 The amendment reflects a consolidation of EU legislation.

8. Consultation outcome

8.1 No consultation as been carried out as this is only a technical change with no impact on policy or enforcement.

9. Guidance

9.1 No guidance has been prepared as this is only a technical change with no impact on policy or enforcement.

10. Impact

10.1 The impact on business, charities or voluntary bodies is negligible as this is a technical change.
