# The Parental Responsibility Agreement (Amendment) Regulations 2009

Made - - - - 21st July 2009

Laid before Parliament 22nd July 2009

Coming into force - - 1st September 2009

The Lord Chancellor makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 4(2) and 104 of the Children Act 1989(1):

#### Citation and commencement

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Parental Responsibility Agreement (Amendment) Regulations 2009 and shall come into force on the 1st September 2009.

#### Amendments to the Parental Responsibility Agreement Regulations 1991

- **2.** The Parental Responsibility Agreement Regulations 1991(**2**) are amended in accordance with regulations 3 and 4.
  - 3. In regulation 2—
    - (a) at the end of paragraph (a) omit "and";
    - (b) for the full stop at the end of paragraph (b) substitute "; and"; and
    - (c) after paragraph (b) insert—
      - "(c) under section 4ZA(1)(b) of that Act (acquisition of parental responsibility by second female parent) shall be made in Form C(PRA3) set out in that Schedule."
- **4.** For the Schedule to the Parental Responsibility Agreement Regulations 1991 substitute the Schedule in the Schedule to these Regulations.

#### To Parent A and the Other Parent with parental responsibility:

When you make the declaration you will have to prove that you have parental responsibility for the child. You should therefore take with you to the court one of the following documents:

- the child's full birth certificate and a marriage certificate or civil partnership certificate to show that the parents were married to each other or were in a civil partnership with each other at the time of birth or subsequently,
- a court order granting parental responsibility,
- a registered Parental Responsibility Agreement Form between the child's mother and father or other parent

 if the birth was registered after the 1 December 2003, the child's full birth certificate showing that the parents jointly registered the child's birth.

You will also require evidence of your (both parents') identity showing a photograph and signature (for example, a photocard, official pass or passport) (Please note that the child's birth certificate cannot be accepted as sufficient proof of your identity.)

To the step-parent: When you make the declaration you will have to prove that you are married to, or the civil partner of, a parent of the child so take to the court your marriage certificate or certificate of civil partnership.

You will also need evidence of your identity showing a photograph and signature (for example, a photocard, official pass or passport).

## When the Certificate has been signed and witnessed

Make sufficient copies of the Agreement Form for each person who has signed the form. You do not need to copy these notes.

Take, or send, the original form and the copies to: The Principal Registry of the Family Division, First Avenue House, 42-49 High Holborn, London, WC1V 6NP.

The Registry will record the Agreement and retain the original form. The copies will be stamped with the seal of the court and sent back to every person with parental responsibility who has signed the Agreement Form and to the step-parent. The Agreement will not take effect until it has been received and recorded at the Principal Registry of the Family Division.

#### **Ending the Agreement**

Once a step-parent parental responsibility agreement has been made it can only end:

- by an order of the court made on the application of any person who has parental responsibility for the child.
- by an order of the court made on the application of the child with permission of the court,
- · when the child reaches the age of 18.

C(PRA3) (Notes) (09.09)

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Parental Responsibility Agreement Regulations 1991. They prescribe a form, C(PRA3), to record an agreement under section 4ZA of the Children Act 1989 (c.41) for the acquisition of parental responsibility by a second female parent. Section 4ZA is inserted into the Children Act 1989 by the Human Fertilisation and Embryology Act 2008 (c.22) and provides for circumstances in which a woman, who is treated as a parent of a child by virtue of section 43 of the 2008 Act, may acquire parental responsibility for that child.

The notes to form C(PRA2) (Step-Parent Parental Responsibility Agreement) are amended to allow for the fact that parental responsibility might be held by persons who were previously in a civil partnership as well as those who were previously married or that a parental responsibility agreement might have been entered into previously by the child's mother and a second female parent.

The amended forms C(PRA2) and C(PRA3) both now ask for the 'gender' of the child and for the sake of consistency form C(PRA1) has been similarly amended.
