ROAD TRAFFIC

The A19 Trunk Road (Easington Interchange to Seaton Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009

Made - - - - - *5 October 2009*

Coming into force - - - - - *18 October 2009*

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A19 Trunk Road and connecting roads, in the County of Durham, is satisfied that traffic on that trunk road and some of those connecting roads should be prohibited because road marking and stud renewal works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A19 Trunk Road (Easington Interchange to Seaton Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 18 October 2009.

2. In this Order; –

“the A19” means the A19 Trunk Road;

“the northbound carriageway” means the A19 northbound carriageway between the nose of the northbound exit slip road at the A182 Easington Interchange and the nose of the northbound entry slip road at the A1018/B1404 Seaton Interchange, a distance of approximately 8125 metres;

“the southbound carriageway” means the A19 southbound carriageway between the nose of the southbound exit slip road at Seaton Interchange and the nose of the southbound entry slip road at the A182 Easington Interchange, a distance of approximately 7885 metres;

“a slip road” means any of the following A19 slip roads:

- (i) the northbound entry slip road at Easington Interchange;
- (ii) the northbound exit and southbound exit and entry slip roads at the A182 Cold Hesledon Interchange;
- (iii) the northbound entry slip road connecting from the B1285 Cold Hesledon Roundabout; and
- (iv) the northbound exit and southbound entry slip roads at Seaton Interchange;

“the works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 19 October 2009 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the northbound carriageway, the southbound carriageway, or a slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer or winter maintenance purposes; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission, of a police officer or traffic officer in uniform.
