## **ROAD TRAFFIC**

# The M27 Motorway (Junctions 1 - 2, Eastbound) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009

Made - - - - 5th October 2009

Coming into force - - 10th October 2009

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M27 Motorway and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that motorway and on one of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M27 Motorway (Junctions 1 - 2, Eastbound) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 10th October 2009.

### 2. In this Order:

"the motorway" means the M27 Motorway in the County of Hampshire;

"the length of eastbound carriageway" means the eastbound carriageway of the motorway from its junction with the A31 at Junction 1 at Cadnam Interchange to its junction with the slip road leading from the A36 at Junction 2 at Ower Interchange;

"the slip road" means the road leading to the eastbound carriageway of the motorway from the B3079 and A31 at Junction 1;

"works" mean bridge and carriageway maintenance work and inspection and gantry work on the motorway; and

"a works period" means a period of 8 hours starting at 2200 hours on Monday 12th October 2009 or on any subsequent day until 9th April 2011.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the length of eastbound carriageway or the slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -
  - (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
  - (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;

(c)	anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform; or
(d)	any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
