**The M4 Motorway (Junctions 15-16) (Temporary Prohibition
and Restriction of Traffic) (No. 2) Order 2009**

<i>Made</i> - - - -	<i>12 October 2009</i>
<i>Coming into force</i> - -	<i>16 October 2009</i>

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M4 Motorway (“the M4”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road and some of those connecting roads at Junction 15 in the Borough of Swindon should be prohibited and restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of, and paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M4 Motorway (Junctions 15-16) (Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) (No.2) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 16 October 2009.

2. In this Order –

“the first length of the M4” means (a) the eastbound carriageway of the M4 from a point 500 metres east of the tip of the nosing with the eastbound exit slip road at Junction 15 to a point at the centre of the B4192 overbridge, Swindon; and (b) the westbound carriageway of the M4 from a point at the centre of the B4192 overbridge, Swindon to a point 500 metres east of the tip of the nosing with the westbound entry slip road at Junction 15;

“the second length of the M4” means (a) the eastbound carriageway of the M4 from a point at the centre of the eastern bridge at the M4 Junction 16 interchange to a point at the centre of the B4192 overbridge; and (b) the westbound carriageway of the M4 from a point at the centre of the B4192 overbridge to the centre point of the eastern bridge at the M4 Junction 16 Interchange;

“the third length of the M4” means (a) the eastbound carriageway of the M4 from the tip of the nosing with the eastbound exit slip road at Junction 15 to the tip of the nosing with the eastbound entry slip road at Junction 15; and (b) the westbound carriageway of the M4 from the tip of the nosing with the westbound exit slip road at Junction 15 to the tip of the nosing with the westbound entry slip road at Junction 15;

“the fourth length of the M4” means (a) the eastbound carriageway of the M4 from a point 1000 metres east of the tip of the nosing with the eastbound exit slip road at Junction 15 to a point at the centre of the B4192 overbridge, Swindon; and (b) the westbound carriageway of

the M4 from a point at the centre of the B4192 overbridge, Swindon to a point 1000 metres east of the tip of the nosing with the westbound entry slip road at Junction 15;

“the slip roads” mean the eastbound entry and exit slip roads and the westbound entry and exit slip roads at M4 Junction 15;

“the works” mean the replacement of safety barriers, drainage and pavement works to the central reservation and verges and the upgrading and replacement of terminals;

“tip of the nosing” means the last point where an exit slip road leaves the carriageway of a motorway or the first point where an entry slip road joins the carriageway of a motorway;

“overall width” has the meaning given in regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986(a);

“the hard shoulder” means the hard shoulder within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations which is adjacent to the fourth length of the M4;

“the Regulations” means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982 (b);

“eastbound carriageway” and “westbound carriageway” mean, respectively, the eastbound carriageway and the westbound carriageway of the first length of the M4;

“the works period” means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Friday 16 October 2009 and ending when the said works have been completed;

“a first works period” means a period of 9 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Friday 16 October 2009 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

“a second works period” means a period of 8 hours starting at 22.00 hours on Friday 16 October 2009 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 6, 7 and 8, no person shall, during the works period:

- (a) drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the first length of the M4 and second length of the M4;
- (b) cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the eastbound carriageway;
- (c) cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the outside lane of the westbound carriageway in any direction other than eastwards;
- (d) cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the westbound carriageway;
- (e) cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the outside lane of the eastbound carriageway in any direction other than westwards.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 6, 7 and 8, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle with an overall width exceeding 6 feet 6 inches to enter or proceed in -

- (a) a lane in a carriageway or length of carriageway where only that lane and the hard shoulder adjacent to that carriageway or length are open for use by traffic proceeding in the same direction,
- (b) any lane other than the left hand or nearside lane of two or more lanes in a carriageway or length of carriageway where only those lanes are open for use by traffic proceeding in the same direction,

and in this article, a reference to a carriageway is a reference to the eastbound carriageway and the westbound carriageway of the first length of the M4 and second length of the M4.

5. Subject as mentioned in articles 6, 7 and 8 no person shall, during a first works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the third length of the M4 and the slip roads.

6. The provisions of articles 3, 4 and 5 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

7. The provisions of articles 3(a), (b), (d), 4 and 5 shall not apply to:

(a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;

(b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer in uniform.

8. The provisions of articles 3(b), (d), 4 and 5 shall not apply to a vehicle being used in connection with the said works or for traffic officer purposes.

9 During a second works period, regulation 5 and (insofar as it relates to a vehicle being driven) regulation 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended, in respect of the hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

10. The M4 Motorway (Junctions 15-16) (Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) Order 2009 is hereby revoked. (a)
