ROAD TRAFFIC

**The M5 Motorway (Junction 20 Southbound Entry Slip Road)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009**

<i>Made</i> - - - -	<i>14 October 2009</i>
<i>Coming into force</i> - -	<i>17 October 2009</i>

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway (“the M5”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on one of those connecting roads at Junction 20 in the North Somerset should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junction 20 Southbound Entry Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 17 October 2009.

2. In this Order –

“the slip road” means the southbound entry slip road at M5 Junction 20;

“the works” mean surveying works;

“a works period” means a period of 9 hours starting at 21.00 hours on Monday 19 October 2009 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform;
- (c) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works.
