ROAD TRAFFIC

The A3(M) Motorway (Junction 5, Carriageways) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009

Made - - - - 26th October 2009

Coming into force - - 31st October 2009

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A3(M) Motorway, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on lengths of that motorway because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A3(M) Motorway (Junction 5, Carriageways) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 31st October 2009.

2. In this Order:

“the motorway” means the A3(M) Motorway at Junction 5 near Havant in the County of Hampshire;

“a length of carriageway” means –

- (i) the northbound carriageway of the motorway between the slip road leading from the eastbound carriageway of the A27 at Broad Marsh Interchange (to the A2030 and B2177) and the slip road leading from the A2030 (Havant Road) and the B2177 (Bedhampton Hill) at Bedhampton Interchange, or
- (ii) the southbound carriageway of the motorway between the slip road leading to the A2030 (Havant Road) and the B2177 (Bedhampton Hill) at Bedhampton Interchange and the slip road leading to the westbound carriageway of the A27 at Broad Marsh Interchange;

“works” mean maintenance work on the motorway; and

“a works period” means a period of 8 hours starting at 2200 hours on Monday 2nd November 2009 or on any subsequent day until 30th April 2011.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a length of carriageway.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;

- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
