ROAD TRAFFIC

The M5 Motorway (Junctions 10-11A) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2009

Made - - - - *11 November 2009*

Coming into force - - *14 November 2009*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway (“the M5”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road in the County of Gloucestershire should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junctions 10-11A) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 14 November 2009.

2. In this Order –

“the M5” means both carriageways of the M5 from a point adjacent to the tip of the nosing of the southbound exit slip road at Junction 10 to a point at the centre of Hucclecote Road overbridge (south of Junction 11A);

“the works” mean concrete barrier protection works;

“overall width” has the meaning given in regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986(b);

“the hard shoulder” means the hard shoulder within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations which is adjacent to the M5;

“the Regulations” mean the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(c);

“the works period” means the period starting at 07.00 hours on Monday 16 November 2009 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the M5 and the hard shoulder.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle with an overall width exceeding 6 feet 6 inches to enter or proceed in -

- (a) a lane in a carriageway or length of carriageway where only that lane and the hard shoulder adjacent to that carriageway or length are open for use by traffic proceeding in the same direction,
- (b) any lane other than the left hand or nearside lane of two or more lanes in a carriageway or length of carriageway where only those lanes are open for use by traffic proceeding in the same direction,

and in this article, a reference to a carriageway is a reference to the northbound carriageway and the southbound carriageway of the M5.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer in uniform.

6. The provisions of article 4 shall not apply to a vehicle being used in connection with the said works or for traffic officer purposes.

7. During the works period, regulation 5 and (insofar as it relates to a vehicle being driven) regulation 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended, in respect of the hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
