## ROAD TRAFFIC

## The M20 Motorway and the A20 Trunk Road (Junction 13, Londonbound Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009

Made - - - - 9th November 2009

Coming into force - - 14th November 2009

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M20 Motorway, the A20 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on some of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M20 Motorway and the A20 Trunk Road (Junction 13, Londonbound Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 14th November 2009.

## 2. In this Order:

"the M20" and "the A20" mean, respectively, the M20 Motorway and the A20 Trunk Road near Folkestone in the County of Kent;

"a slip road" means -

- (i) the road leading from the Londonbound carriageway of the A20 to the A259/A20 Cherry Garden Avenue at M20 Junction 13, or
- (ii) the road leading from the A259/A20 Cherry Garden Avenue to the Londonbound carriageway of the M20 at Junction 13;

"works" mean resurfacing work on the M20 and the A20; and

"a works period" means a period of 10 hours starting at 2000 hours on Monday 16th November 2009 or on any subsequent day until 13th May 2011.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -
  - (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
  - (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;

- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
