ROAD TRAFFIC

The A20 Trunk Road (East of Roundhill Tunnel) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009

Made - - - - 23rd November 2009

Coming into force - - 28th November 2009

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A20 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road and on one of those connecting roads because works are being executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A20 Trunk Road (East of Roundhill Tunnel) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 28th November 2009.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A20 Trunk Road in the County of Kent;

“the slip road” means the road leading from the A260 to the westbound carriageway of the trunk road at Alkham Valley Interchange;

“the length of westbound carriageway” means the westbound carriageway of the trunk road between points 560 metres east and 255 metres west of the A260 overbridge (Canterbury Road);

“works” means traffic management removal and white lining work on the trunk road; and

“a works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 2000 hours on Tuesday 1st December 2009 or on any subsequent day until 27th May 2011.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the length of westbound carriageway or the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to –

(a) 1984 c.27; a new section 14 was substituted by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 (c.26), section 1(1) and Schedule 1.

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or a traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
