ROAD TRAFFIC

The A20 Trunk Road (Alkham Valley Interchange and Courtwood Interchange, Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (No.2) Order 2009

Made - - - - *14th December 2009*

Coming into force - - *21st January 2010*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A20 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on some of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A20 Trunk Road (Alkham Valley Interchange and Courtwood Interchange, Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (No.2) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 21st January 2010 and shall apply for a period of twelve months.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A20 Trunk Road near Folkestone in the County of Kent;

“a slip road” means –

- (a) at Alkham Valley Interchange (A260):
 - (i) any road leading to or from the coastbound carriageway of the trunk road, or
 - (ii) any road leading to or from the Londonbound carriageway of the trunk road;
- (b) at Courtwood Interchange near Capel-le-Ferne (B2011):
 - (i) any road leading to or from the coastbound carriageway of the trunk road, or
 - (ii) any road leading to or from the Londonbound carriageway of the trunk road;

“works” mean cyclic maintenance and/or emergency repair work on the trunk road; and

“a works period” means a period of 9 hours starting at 2000 hours on Thursday 21st January 2010 or on any subsequent day until Thursday 20th January 2011.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;
- (c) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes; or
- (d) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform.
