ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A27 Trunk Road (South of Cophall Roundabout – East of
Pevensey Bypass Roundabout) (Temporary Speed Restrictions)
Order 2010**

Made - - - - *8th March 2010*

Coming into force - - *13th March 2010*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A27 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be restricted on a length of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A27 Trunk Road (South of Cophall Roundabout – East of Pevensey Bypass Roundabout) (Temporary Speed Restrictions) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 13th March 2010.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A27 Trunk Road in the County of East Sussex;

“the length of trunk road” means the trunk road between points 1000 metres south of Cophall roundabout (Polegate By-pass/A22) and 1000 metres east of Pevensey Bypass roundabout (A22 Golden Jubilee Way);

“works” means carriageway repairs and all associated work on the trunk road; and

“a works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 2000 hours on Monday 15th March 2010 or on any subsequent day until 12th September 2011.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding –

(a) 10 miles per hour on the length of trunk road while traffic signs of a character authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 indicating “convoy working” on that length of road are displayed; or

(b) 40 miles per hour on the length of trunk road while the traffic signs specified in paragraph (a) of this article in relation to that length of road are not displayed.

(a) 1984 c.27; a new section 14 was substituted by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 (c.26), section 1(1) and Schedule 1.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to a vehicle being used for police, ambulance or fire and rescue authority purposes.
