Citation, commencement and extent

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 (Intervention Orders) (Amendment) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 30th April 2010.
 - (2) This Order extends to England and Wales.

Amendment of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 (Intervention Orders) Order 2006

- 2. For article 4(a) of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 (Intervention Orders) Order 2006(2) substitute—
 - "(a) "appropriate activities" are such activities as are involved in the provision of drug misuse treatment services under the "Models of care for treatment of adult drug misusers: Update 2006" published by the National Treatment Agency for Substance Misuse in July 2006, and".
