ROAD TRAFFIC

The M5 Motorway (Junctions 3 to 4) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - 6 April 2010

Coming into force - -13 April 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway ("the M5") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that motorway and on two of those connecting roads in the Metropolitan Borough of Dudley and the County of Worcestershire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junctions 3 to 4) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 13 April 2010.

2. In this Order -

"the motorway" means the northbound and southbound carriageways of

the M5 between junctions 3 and 4;

"a slip road" means –

i) the slip road leading to the northbound carriageway of the M5 at Junction 4; and

ii) the slip road leading to the southbound carriageway of the M5 at Junction 3;

"the works period" means the period starting at 23.00 hours on Saturday 17

April 2010 and ending when the said works have been

completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the motorway or a slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle -

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable or a traffic officer in uniform; or
- (c) being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
