**The M45 Motorway (Dunchurch, Warwickshire) (Temporary
Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010**

Made - - - -21 June 2010

Coming into force - -28 June 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M45 Motorway ("the M45") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that motorway and on two of those connecting roads between Thurlaston and Dunchurch, in the County of Warwickshire should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M45 Motorway (Dunchurch, Warwickshire) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 28 June 2010.

2. In this Order –

"the motorway" means the eastbound and westbound carriageways of the M45 from its roundabout junction with the A45 Coventry Road and B4429 at Thurlaston to a point 3 kilometres east of the A45 Daventry Road underbridge at Dunchurch;

"a slip road" means –
i) the slip road leading to the westbound carriageway of the M45 from the A45 Daventry Road;
ii) the slip road leading from the eastbound carriageway of the M45 to its roundabout junction with the A45 Daventry Road and the B4429;

"the works period" means the period starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 5 July 2010 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the motorway.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on a slip road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle –

(a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or

(b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable;

and nothing in article 4 shall apply to any vehicle being used for or in connection with the said works or by or with the permission of, a traffic officer in uniform.
