**The M6 Motorway (Junctions 36-37, Northbound Carriageway)
(Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010**

Made - - - - - *29 July 2010*

Coming into force - - - - - *14 August 2010*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Motorway is satisfied that traffic on a section of that motorway in the District of South Lakeland in the County of Cumbria should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M6 Motorway (Junctions 36-37, Northbound Carriageway) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 14 August 2010.

2. In this Order:

“the motorway” means the M6 Motorway between Junctions 36 and 37;

“the length of carriageway” means a section of the northbound carriageway of the motorway from a point 860 metres south of the western parapet of Hutton bridge to a point 470 metres north of the centreline of Bull Coppy bridge;

“the works period” means a period starting at 2000 hours on Sunday 15 August 2010 and ending at 0600 hours on Monday 23 August 2010. Work may start and continue beyond these dates for such further period not exceeding 18 months as shall be required to complete the work;

“works” means resurfacing works on the motorway;

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to be driven in the length of carriageway at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour.

4. The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to a vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance services or anything done at the direction of, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.
