**The M50 Motorway (Junction 3, Gorsley Common,
Herefordshire) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010**

Made - - - - 22 January 2010

Coming into force - - 29 January 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M50 Motorway ("the M50") is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway at Gorsley Common in the District of the County of Herefordshire should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order :-

1. This Order may be cited as the M50 Motorway (Junction 3, Gorsley Common, Herefordshire) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 29 January 2010.

2. In this Order –

"the motorway" means the westbound carriageway of the M50 between points 615 metres southwest and 1515 metres southwest of the B4221 overbridge at Junction 3;

"the works period" means the period starting at 08.00 hours on Monday 1 February 2010 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the motorway.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle –

(a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or

(b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable in uniform.
