ROAD TRAFFIC

The A5 Trunk Road (Burntwood, Staffordshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - 15 February 2010

Coming into force - - -22 February 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport being the traffic authority for the A5 Trunk Road (“the A5”) is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road at Burntwood in the County of Staffordshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A5 Trunk Road (Burntwood, Staffordshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 22 February 2010.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the eastbound carriageway of the A5 from a point 60 metres west of the centrepiece of its junction with the B5011, to the centrepiece of that junction, excluding the dedicated left turn lane;

“the works period” means the period starting at 22.00 hours on Monday 1 March 2010 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the trunk road.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to make a left turn from the A5 into the A5195.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle –

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable in uniform; or
- (c) being used in connection with the said works.
