REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE, NORTHERNIRELAND

The Parliamentary Elections (Returning Officer's Charges) (Northern Ireland) Order 2010

Made - - - 15th March 2010

Coming into force in accordance with article 1(1)

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 29(3) and (4C) of the Representation of the People Act 1983(1), makes the following Order with the consent of the Treasury(2):

Citation, commencement and extent

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Parliamentary Elections (Returning Officer's Charges) (Northern Ireland) Order 2010 and it comes into force on the day after the day on which it is made.
 - (2) This Order extends to Northern Ireland only.

Overall maximum recoverable amount

- **2.** For the purposes of section 29(3) of the Representation of the People Act 1983 the amount specified as the overall maximum recoverable amount at—
 - (a) an uncontested parliamentary election in each constituency is £1,750.00; and
 - (b) at a contested parliamentary election in a constituency is the amount specified in respect of that constituency in the table in the Schedule to this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

Section 29(3) of the Representation of the People Act 1983 enables the Secretary of State to specify in an Order the overall maximum recoverable amount that a returning officer may recover in respect of services rendered or expenses incurred for or in connection with a parliamentary election.

This Order specifies those amounts in respect of each constituency in Northern Ireland (of which there are 18). At an uncontested election in any constituency the amount is £1,750.00. At a contested election, the amount for each constituency is set out in the table in the Schedule to the Order.

Status: This is the original version (as it was originally made). This item of legislation is currently only available in its original format.

This Order also revokes the Parliamentary Elections (Returning Officer's Charges) (Northern Ireland) Order 2005.

A full impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument as no impact on the private or voluntary sector is foreseen.
