ROAD TRAFFIC

The M5 Motorway (Junctions 12-11A) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - - 6 January 2010
Coming into force - - - - - 9 January 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway (“the M5”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road between Junction 12 and Junction 11A in the County of Gloucestershire should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junction 12-11A) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 9 January 2010.

2. In this Order –

“the M5” means the northbound carriageway of the M5 from a point at the centre of the Upton Lane Bridge (north of Junction 12) to a point at the centre of the Brockworth Road Bridge (north of Junction 11A);

“the works” mean resurfacing works;

“the hard shoulder” means the hard shoulder within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations which is adjacent to the M5;

“the Regulations” mean the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b);

“a works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 11 January 2010 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the M5 and the hard shoulder.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer in uniform.

5. During a works period, regulation 5 and (insofar as it relates to a vehicle being driven) regulation 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended, in respect of the hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
