(Amendment No. 2) Order 2011

Coming into force in accordance with article 1

The Lord Chancellor, after consulting the Lord Chief Justice, makes the following Order in exercise of powers conferred by section 92(6) of and Part 1 of Schedule 11 to the Children Act 1989⁽¹⁾.

Citation and Commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Allocation and Transfer of Proceedings (Amendment No. 2) Order 2011 and comes into force—

- (a) in respect of Chorley County Court, on 12th September 2011;
- (b) in respect of Rawtenstall County Court and Shrewsbury County Court, on 3rd October 2011.

Revocation of Jurisdiction

2. Chorley County Court, Rawtenstall County Court and Shrewsbury County Court shall cease to be family hearing centres.

Amendments to the Allocation and Transfer of Proceedings Order 2008

3. The Allocation and Transfer of Proceedings Order 2008⁽²⁾ shall be amended by deleting the entries in Schedule 1 (classes of county court) to that Order relating to:

- (a) Chorley County Court;
- (b) Rawtenstall County Court; and
- (c) Shrewsbury County Court.
