ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A1 Trunk Road (South of Blyth, Nottinghamshire)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

Made - - - - *18th March 2011*
Coming into force - - *25th March 2011*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A1 Trunk Road (“the A1”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road, near Blyth in the County of Nottinghamshire should be prohibited because of the likelihood of danger to the public:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A1 Trunk Road (South of Blyth, Nottinghamshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 25th March 2011.

2. In this Order:

“the central reservation” means that part of the trunk road which separates its carriageways for the safety and guidance of vehicular traffic using that road;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the period starting at 00:01 on Monday 28th March 2011 and ending when the said likelihood of danger has been avoided by means other than this order, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed through the gap in the central reservation of the A1 opposite Tinker Lane, approximately 1900 metres south of the centreline of the A634 Spital Road southbound overbridge.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
