**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The M1 Motorway (Junctions 24 – 25) (Temporary Restriction  
and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

*Made* - - - - - *31st December 2012*

*Coming into force* - - - - - *7th January 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M1 Motorway (“the M1”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that motorway and some of those connecting roads in the Counties of Leicestershire and Derbyshire, should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and regulation 16(2) of the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982 (b), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M1 Motorway (Junctions 24 – 25) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 7th January 2013.

2. In this Order –

“the first length of motorway” means –

- i) the northbound carriageway of the M1 from its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 24 to its junction with the entry slip road at Junction 25; and
- ii) the southbound carriageway of the M1 from its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 25 to its junction with the entry slip road at Junction 24;

“the second length of motorway” means

- i) the northbound carriageway of the M1 from a point 850 metres south of its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 24 to a point 90

metres north of its junction with the entry slip road at Junction 25; and

- ii) the southbound carriageway of the M1 from a point 850 metres north of its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 25 to a point 90 metres south of its junction with the entry slip road at Junction 24;

"a slip road"

means the slip road leading –

- i) to the southbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 25;
- ii) from the southbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 24;
- iii) to the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 24;
- iv) to the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 24a; and
- v) from the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 25;

"the link road"

means the link road leading from the southbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 24a to the westbound carriageway of the A50;

"the Regulations"

means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982;

"a hard shoulder"

means the hard shoulder, within the meaning of Regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations, which is adjacent to the first length of motorway;

"the works period"

means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 14th January 2013 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in second length of motorway.

**4.** Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the first length of motorway, a slip road or the link road.

**5.** The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

**6.** The provisions of:

(a) articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle -

(i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes, or

(ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable;

- (b) article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle being used for special forces purposes; and
- (c) article 4 shall not apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.

7. During the works period, regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended in respect of a hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
