## ROAD TRAFFIC

The M20 Motorway and the A20 Trunk Road (Junctions 12 and 13, Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014

Made - - - - 20th January 2014

Coming into force - - 8th February 2014

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M20 Motorway, the A20 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on some of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M20 Motorway and the A20 Trunk Road (Junctions 12 and 13, Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 8th February 2014.

## 2. In this Order:

"the M20" and "the A20" mean, respectively, the M20 Motorway and the A20 Trunk Road near Folkestone in the County of Kent;

"a slip road" means -

- (i) the road leading from the A20/B2064 to the coastbound carriageway of the M20 at Junction 12, or
- (ii) the road leading from the Londonbound carriageway of the A20 to the M20/A259 at Junction 13;

"works" mean CCTV camera systems renewal, inspection and maintenance work on the M20 and the A20; and

"a works period" means a period of 6 hours starting at 2200 hours on Thursday 13th February 2014 or on any subsequent day until 7th August 2015.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -
  - (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;

- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
