The South Sudan (Sanctions) (Overseas Territories) Order 2014

PART 2

Restricted goods etc.

Providing or carrying restricted goods

- 7.—(1) It is an offence for a person to knowingly sell, supply, transfer or export (directly or indirectly) restricted goods—
 - (a) to any person in South Sudan, or
 - (b) for use in South Sudan.
- (2) It is an offence for a relevant person to knowingly use a ship, aircraft or vehicle falling within paragraph (3) for the carriage of restricted goods if the carriage is, or forms part of, carriage from any place outside South Sudan to any destination in South Sudan.
 - (3) The following fall within this paragraph—
 - (a) a ship, aircraft or vehicle within the Territory,
 - (b) a ship or aircraft registered in the Territory, or
 - (c) any other ship or aircraft that is for the time being chartered to a person mentioned in article 2(1)(a) or (b).
- (4) A "relevant person", in relation to a ship, aircraft or vehicle falling within paragraph (3)(a) or (b), means—
 - (a) the owner or master of the ship,
 - (b) the charterer, operator or commander of the aircraft, or
 - (c) the driver or operator of the vehicle.
 - (5) A "relevant person", in relation to a ship or aircraft falling within paragraph (3)(c) means—
 - (a) the charterer of the ship or aircraft, or
 - (b) the master of the ship, or operator of the aircraft, if the master or operator is a person mentioned in article 2(1)(a) or (b).
- (6) Paragraph (2) is without prejudice to any other provision of law prohibiting or restricting the use of ships, aircraft or vehicles.
 - (7) This article is subject to articles 10 and 11.

Providing assistance related to restricted goods

- **8.**—(1) It is an offence for a person to knowingly provide (directly or indirectly) assistance relating to the sale, supply, transfer or export of restricted goods
 - (a) to any person in South Sudan, or
 - (b) for use in South Sudan.

- (2) It is an offence for a person to knowingly provide (directly or indirectly) assistance relating to the maintenance, manufacture or use of restricted goods—
 - (a) by any person in South Sudan, or
 - (b) for use in South Sudan.
 - (3) This article is subject to articles 10 and 11.

Providing assistance related to military activities

- **9.**—(1) It is an offence for a person to knowingly provide (directly or indirectly) assistance related to military activities in South Sudan.
 - (2) This article is subject to articles 10 and 11.
