**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (East Fortune)  
Regulations 2015**

*Made* - - - - *30th March 2015*

*Coming into force* - - *25th July 2015*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of East Fortune, East Lothian by reason of a flying display that is scheduled to take place there on 25th July 2015.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009(a).

**Citation and commencement**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (East Fortune) Regulations 2015 and come into force on 25th July 2015.

**Interpretation**

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(b).

**Restricted airspace**

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1115 hours and 1615 hours on 25th July 2015, no aircraft is to fly below 5,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 5 nautical miles whose centre is at 555947N 0024237W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying with the permission of the East Fortune Airshow flying display director.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in airspace in the vicinity of East Fortune, East Lothian by reason of an air display that is scheduled to take place there on 25th July 2015 by way of Scotland's National Airshow. A large number of civil and military aircraft will be involved in high-energy manoeuvres during the display. Accordingly, the Civil Aviation Authority's Safety and Airspace Regulation Group considers that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the display for reasons of public safety and this has been agreed with the Department for Transport.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Universal Co-ordinated Time (UTC), which for the purpose of these Regulations is one hour behind British Summer Time.

Full details of the Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular and NOTAM.
