#### **Citation and commencement**

**1.**—(1) This Order may be cited as the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 (Appeals under Part 2) (Amendment) Order 2015.

(2) This Order comes into force on 30th November 2015.

#### Amendment of the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 (Appeals under Part 2) Order 2003

**2.**—(1) The Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 (Appeals under Part 2) Order 2003(2) is amended as follows.

- (2) In article 11 (leave to appeal to Supreme Court), before "33" insert "13B(4),(3)".
- (3) In article 12 (application for leave to appeal), in paragraph (1), before "33" insert "13B(4),".
- (4) In article 14 (presence at hearing), before "33" insert "13B(4),".

Section 13B was inserted into the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 by section 7 of the Serious Crime Act 2015 (c. 9) which came into force on 1st June 2015.
