The Naval, Military and Air Forces Etc. (Disablement and Death) Service Pensions (Amendment) Order 2015

Made - - - - 11th February 2015

Laid before Parliament 18th February 2015

Coming into force - - 6th April 2015

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 11th day of February 2015

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty considers it expedient to amend the Naval, Military and Air Forces Etc. (Disablement and Death) Service Pensions Order 2006(a).

ACCORDINGLY, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by sections 12(1) and 24(3) of the Social Security (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1977(**b**), and of all other powers enabling Her to do so, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order as follows:

Citation and commencement

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Naval, Military and Air Forces Etc. (Disablement and Death) Service Pensions (Amendment) Order 2015 and shall come into force on 6th April 2015.
- (2) In this Order "the principal Order" means the Naval, Military and Air Forces Etc. (Disablement and Death) Service Pensions Order 2006.

Amendment to article 33 (relationships subsequent to the award of a pension) of the principal Order

- **2.** Article 33 (relationships subsequent to the award of a pension) of the principal Order is amended by—
 - (a) inserting at the end of paragraph (1) "before the 1st April 2015",
 - (b) substituting for paragraph (2)—
 - "(2) Where—
 - (a) in accordance with paragraph (1), an award to a person ceased, and

(b) that person applies to restore the award in respect of a period which begins after the end of the relationship that led to the cessation of the award,

the claim shall be determined as though the relationship had never existed."

 - (e) the table in Schedule 5 for the table in Schedule 2, Part III of the principal Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order amends the Naval, Military and Air Forces Etc. (Disablement and Death) Service Pensions Order 2006 which makes provision for pensions and other awards in respect of disablement or death due to service before 6th April 2005 in the naval, military and air forces.

Article 2 makes amendments to stop the cessation of pensions to surviving spouses and civil partners in the event that they co-habit or remarry. This provision also enables persons whose subsequent relationship has come to an end, to apply for the restoration of their surviving spouse or civil partner pension.

Article 3 substitutes the Tables in Schedules 1 to 5 thereby varying the rates of retired pay, pensions, gratuities and allowances in respect of disablement or death due to service in the armed forces.
