EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO

THE PLANT HEALTH (ENGLAND) (AMENDMENT) (No. 2) ORDER 2017

2017 No. 1220

1. Introduction

1.1 This explanatory memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and is laid before Parliament by Command of Her Majesty.

2. Purpose of the instrument

2.1 This instrument amends the Plant Health (England) Order 2015 (S.I. 2015 No. 610) ("the principal Order") which contains measures to prevent the introduction and spread of harmful plant pests and diseases. It implements the specific control measures in Commission Implementing Decisions (EU) 2017/801 and (EU) 2017/198 and Commission Implementing Directive (EU) 2017/1279. It also implements Decision No 1/2015 of the Joint Committee on Agriculture set up by the agreement between the European Community and the Swiss Confederation on trade in agricultural products (2017/169/EU).

3. Matters of special interest to Parliament

Matters of special interest to the Joint Committee on Statutory Instruments

3.1 None.

Other matters of interest to the House of Commons

3.2 As this instrument is subject to negative resolution procedure and has not been prayed against, consideration as to whether there are other matters of interest to the House of Commons does not arise at this stage.

4. Legislative Context

- 4.1 Council Directive 2000/29/EC on protective measures against the introduction into the EU of organisms harmful to plants or plant products and against their spread within the EU¹ ("the Plant Health Directive") establishes the EU plant health regime. The Plant Health Directive is implemented in England by the Plant Health (England) Order 2015 and, in relation to forestry matters, by the Plant Health (Forestry) Order 2005 (S.I. 2005/2517) which extends to Great Britain. Similar but separate legislation to the principal Order operates in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
- 4.2 A number of EU instruments have been adopted which modify the annexes of the Plant Health Directive as a result of technical changes in the assessment of risks presented by particular pests and diseases and introduce new measures to address risks presented by other pests and diseases.

- 4.3 Decision 1/2015 of the Joint Committee on Agriculture responsible for administering the agreement between the European Community and the Swiss Confederation on trade in agricultural products amends the appendices to Annex 4 of that Agreement to reflect changes to the legislative provisions of the EU and Switzerland regarding plant health. Annex 4 is implemented in England by the Plant Health (England) Order 2005 and this instrument makes the necessary amendments to the Order.
- 4.4 These amendments are to be implemented through this instrument which comes into force on 1 January 2017. The changes are described in more detail below.

5. Extent and Territorial Application

- 5.1 The extent of this instrument is to England and Wales.
- 5.2 The territorial application of this instrument is England.

6. European Convention on Human Rights

As the instrument is subject to negative resolution procedure and does not amend primary legislation, no statement is required.

7. Policy background

What is being done and why

- 7.1 The Plant Health Directive (Council Directive 2000/29/EC) establishes the EU plant health regime. It contains measures to be taken in order to prevent the introduction into, and spread within, the EU of serious pests and diseases of plants and plant produce. The Directive (and therefore the principal Order) are updated frequently, to take account of new or revised risk assessments, pest interceptions, changes in distribution of pests and other developments. This instrument implements the specific EU measures arising from technical changes in the assessment of the risks presented by particular pests and diseases.
- 7.2 These measures are contained in several pieces of EU legislation:
 - <u>Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2017/801</u> which amends Implementing Decision (EU) 2016/715 on measures in respect of citrus fruits originating in Brazil, Uruguay and South Africa to prevent the introduction into and the spread within the Union of the harmful organism *Phyllosticta citricarpa* (Citrus blackspot).
 - <u>Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2017/198</u> which extends and amends the measures in Commission Implementing Decision 2012/756/EU to prevent the introduction into and the spread within the Union of *Pseudomonas syringae* (bacterial canker of kiwifruit).
 - Commission Implementing Directive (EU) 2017/1279 which amends Annexes I to V to Council Directive 2000/29/EC on protective measures against the introduction into the Community of organisms harmful to plants or plant products and against their spread within the Community reflecting technical changes in the assessment of risks presented by particular pests and diseases and introduces new measures to address risks presented by other pests and diseases. A summary of the changes introduced by Commission Implementing Directive (EU) 2017/1279/EU can be found in the Annex, together with a Transposition Note showing how the Directive is implemented by this Order.

Decision No 1/2015 of the Joint Committee on Agriculture concerning the amendment to Appendices 1, 2 and 4 to Annex 4 to the Agreement between the European Community and the Swiss Confederation on trade in agricultural products. Plant material originating in Switzerland (as a non-member of the EU) would normally be subject to the plant health controls set out in the Directive applicable to third countries. Annex 4 of the agreement is intended to facilitate trade between the EU and Switzerland in plant material subject to plant health controls. Appendices to Annex 4 set out what controls should be applied to plant material originating in either the EU or Switzerland and moving to the other party and to material arriving in either party via the other from a third country. In most cases Switzerland is treated as a Member State for plant health purposes. This means that material can be traded without the usual additional requirements which apply to third country material, which is beneficial both to industry and the plant health services. Decision 1/2015 (2017/169/EU) amends appendices 1, 2 and 4 of Annex 4 to reflect changes in the plant health legislative provisions of both parties, which are intended to facilitate trade by further extending the range of plant health material for which equivalence arrangements apply.

Consolidation

7.3 This is not a consolidation as this is the third instrument to amend the principal Order.

8. Consultation outcome

8.1 The changes outlined in paragraph 7.2 reflect those already in place at the EU level, which have been published by the European Commission. Some issues (i.e. *Phyllosticta citricarpa* and *Pseudomonas syringae*) have been subject to consultations with the sectors involved, while the others are mainly technical updates or have limited impact on UK business.

9. Guidance

9.1 The main stakeholders likely to be affected will be informed of the transposition of these EU changes and a summary of the measures will be placed on the Defra website.

10. Impact

- 10.1 There is no impact on business, charities or voluntary bodies. The requirements apply mainly in countries exporting to the EU.
- 10.2 There is no impact on the public sector.
- 10.3 An impact assessment has not been prepared for this instrument.

11. Regulating small business

- 11.1 The legislation applies to activities that are undertaken by small businesses.
- 11.2 The legislation applies equally to all businesses importing controlled plant health material, including small businesses. The risk of introducing harmful organisms is not mitigated by the size of the business.

12. Monitoring & review

12.1 The Directive (and therefore the Order) are updated frequently, to take account of new or revised risk assessments, pest interceptions, changes in distribution of pests and other developments. A new EU Plant Health Regulation has recently been published as part of a package of revised regulations under the agri-food chain.

COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING DIRECTIVES (EU) 2017/1279 - SUMMARY OF CHANGES

Commission Implementing Directive (EU) 2017/1279 of 14 July 2017 amend Annexes I, II, III, IV and V of Council Directive 2000/29/EC ('the Plant Health Directive'). The changes are to be implemented in England through an amendment to the Plant Health (England) Order 2015, due to come into force on 1 January 2018.

A summary of the changes relevant for the UK is outlined below.

General amendments

- The following spelling errors are corrected:
 - Phyloosticta solitaria Ell. and Ev. replaced by Phyllosticta solitaria Ellis & Everhart
 - o Popilia japonica Newman replaced by Popillia japonica Newman
 - o Aleurocantus spp. replaced by Aleurocanthus spp.
 - o Aonidella citrina Coquillet replaced by Aonidiella citrina Coquillet
 - o Amiris P. Browne replaced by Amyris P. Browne
 - o *Xanthomonas campestris* pv. *pruni* (Smith) Dye is renamed as *Xanthomonas arboricola* pv. *pruni* (Smith) Vauterin *et al*.
 - o Zea mais L.' is replaced by Zea mays L.

<u>Amendments to Annex IAI - Harmful organisms not known to occur in EU and whose introduction and spread is prohibited within EU</u>

- Anoplophora malasiaca (Forster) deleted. (Considered to be a synonym of Anoplophora chinensis (Thomson), which is already included in Section I of Part A of Annex I to Directive 2000/29/EC).
- Bactericera cockerelli (Sulc.), Keiferia lycopersicella (Walsingham), Saperda candida Fabricius and Thaumatotibia leucotreta (Meyrick) added.
- Guignardia citricarpa Kiely renamed as *Phyllosticta citricarpa* (McAlpine) Van der Aa and moved from Annex IIAI to Annex IAI.

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• Xanthomonas campestris renamed as Xanthomonas citri pv. aurantifolii and Xanthomonas citri pv. citri. and moved from Annex IIAI to Annex IAI.

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Amendments to Annex IAII - Harmful organisms known to occur in EU and whose introduction and spread is prohibited within EU

- *Xylella fastidiosa* (Wells *et al.*) change in listing from Annex IAI to Annex IAII.
- Elm phlöem necrosis mycoplasm has been renamed 'Candidatus Phytoplasma ulmi and moved from Annex IAI to Annex IAII

- Changes to protected zones in Portugal for *Bemisia tabaci* Genn. (European populations).
