The Judicial Pensions (Fee-Paid Judges) Regulations 2017

PART 3

RETIREMENT BENEFITS[F1: Post-1995 Provisions]

Retirement aged 65 or over due to ill-health: entitlement to ill-health ordinary pension

- 19.—(1) This regulation applies where—
 - (a) [FIP has accrued reckonable service in relation to one or more relevant offices and] retires (whether before, on or after the commencement day);
 - (b) on the day on which P retires, P-
 - (i) has reached the age of 65; and
 - (ii) has less than 5 years' qualifying judicial service; and
 - (c) the ill-health certification condition is met in relation to P.
- (2) On the pension start day, P becomes entitled to the payment for life of a pension [F2 in respect of the relevant offices].
 - (3) In this regulation "the pension start day" means—
 - (a) the day after that on which P retires, or
 - (b) if later, the commencement day.
