

**EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO**  
**THE MESOTHELIOMA LUMP SUM PAYMENTS (CONDITIONS AND AMOUNTS)**  
**(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2018**

**2018 No. 315**

**1. Introduction**

1.1 This explanatory memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Work and Pensions and is laid before Parliament by Command of Her Majesty.

**2. Purpose of the instrument**

2.1 The Child Maintenance and Other Payments Act 2008<sup>1</sup> (the 2008 Act) makes provision for lump sum compensation payments to be made to people suffering from Diffuse Mesothelioma, or their dependants, who meet the conditions of entitlement. One of the conditions of entitlement is that the sufferer has not received certain payments specified in the 2008 Act.

2.2 The compensation payments are paid according to the age of the sufferer and this instrument increases the amounts of compensation paid to sufferers, or their dependants, by 3.0%.

3.2 Disregarding minor or consequential changes, the territorial application of this instrument includes Scotland.

**4. Legislative Context**

4.1 There is no obligation to increase the rates of payments under the 2008 Act; however the Government has reviewed the rates in order to maintain their value in line with inflation. This instrument increases the current rates of payments set out in the Mesothelioma Lump Sum Payments (Conditions and Amounts) Regulations 2008<sup>2</sup> (the 2008 Regulations) by 3.0%.

4.2 The rates of payment set out in the 2008 Regulations were last updated on 1 April 2017.

**5. Extent and Territorial Application**

5.1 The extent of this instrument is Great Britain.

5.2 The territorial application of this instrument is Great Britain.

5.3 Subject to the agreement of the Northern Ireland Assembly, the Department for Communities in Northern Ireland will be making corresponding provisions for Northern Ireland.

## **6. European Convention on Human Rights**

6.1 The Minister for Disabled People, Health and Work, Sarah Newton, has made the following statement regarding Human Rights:

“In my view the provisions of the Mesothelioma Lump Sum Payments (Conditions and Amounts) (Amendment) Regulations 2018 are compatible with the Convention rights.”

## **7. Policy background**

### *What is being done and why*

7.1 Part 4 of the Child Maintenance and Other Payments Act 2008<sup>3</sup> (the 2008 Act) enables a lump sum to be paid to people with Diffuse Mesothelioma, or to their dependants where the sufferers did not claim in their lifetime. “Dependant” has a specific meaning set out in section 3 of the Pneumoconiosis etc. (Workers' Compensation) Act 1979<sup>4</sup>.

7.2 Although there is no obligation under the legislation to increase the level of payments, the Government has decided to increase the amounts set out in the Mesothelioma Lump Sum Payments (Conditions and Amounts) Regulations 2008 by 3.0% - the rate of inflation as measured by the September 2017 Consumer Price Index. As payments made under this scheme are in respect of people who have been disabled through asbestos related disease, in some cases through work, they are being up-rated in line with other disability benefits.

### *Consolidation*

7.3 This instrument increases the rates paid under the 2008 Act and therefore consolidation is not relevant.

## **8. Consultation outcome**

8.1 There is no duty to consult over these increases and a consultation has not been carried out. These increases are at the rate of inflation as measured by the Consumer Prices Index and are in line with the uprating of Industrial Injuries benefits and other social security disability benefits rates which are increased under other statutory provisions.

## **9. Guidance**

9.1 A guidance bulletin detailing new rates will be issued, prior to the new rates being implemented, to claim processors with responsibility for processing these claims in the DWP Barrow office.

## **10. Impact**

10.1 There is no impact on business, charities or voluntary bodies.

10.2 The impact on the public sector is negligible. There will be an estimated £0.25m increase to the DWP Departmental Expenditure Limit.

10.3 An Impact Assessment has not been prepared for this instrument.

**11. Regulating small business**

11.1 The legislation does not apply to activities that are undertaken by small businesses.

**12. Monitoring & review**

12.1 The changes in the payable rates aim to maintain the value of payments in line with inflation. It is intended that these rates will be reviewed each year.
